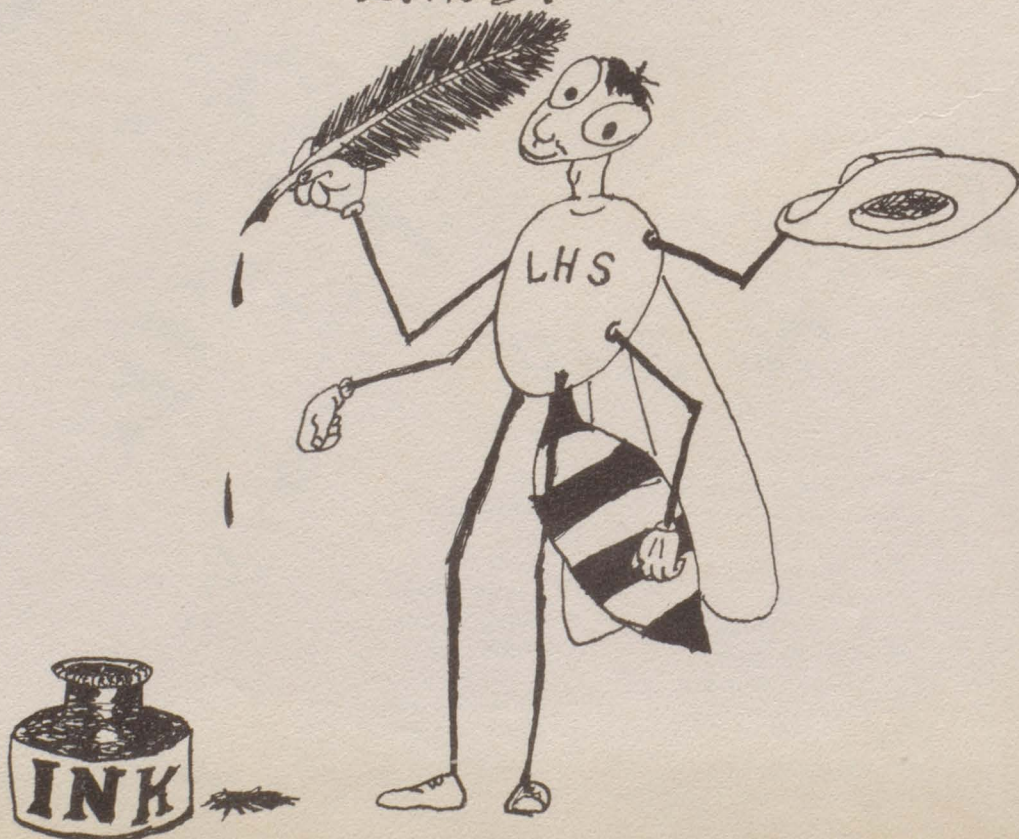
Foreword

We hope that our school, in the future, will strive on and never quit. We also hope that those boys will stand stolid and strong as these granite hills from which they sprang.

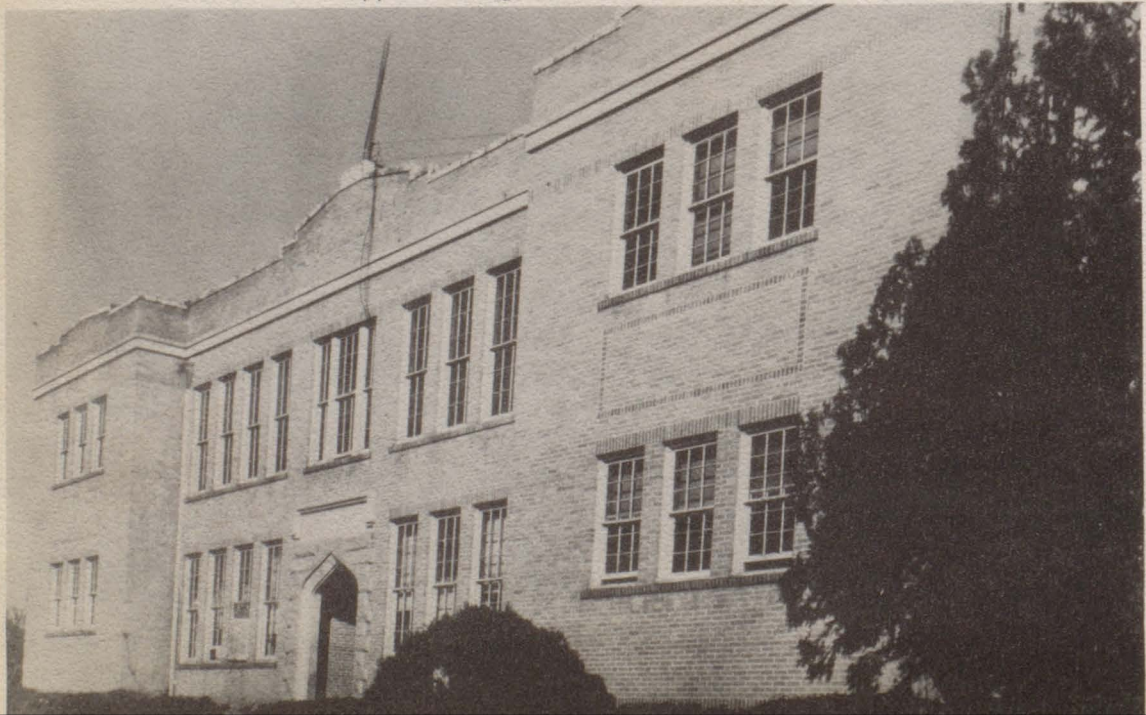

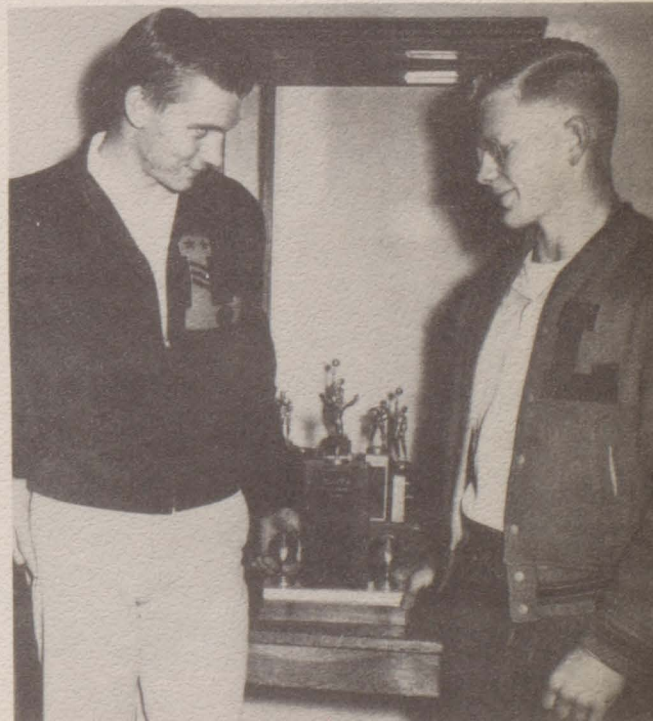
Coaches And Co-Captains

Larry and Leroy have played football for four years and have been co-captains for two years.

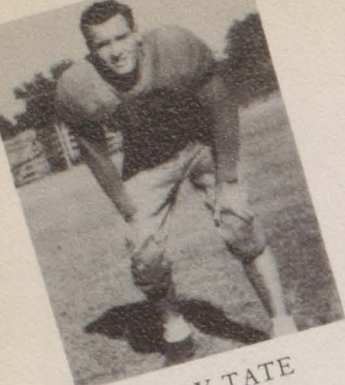

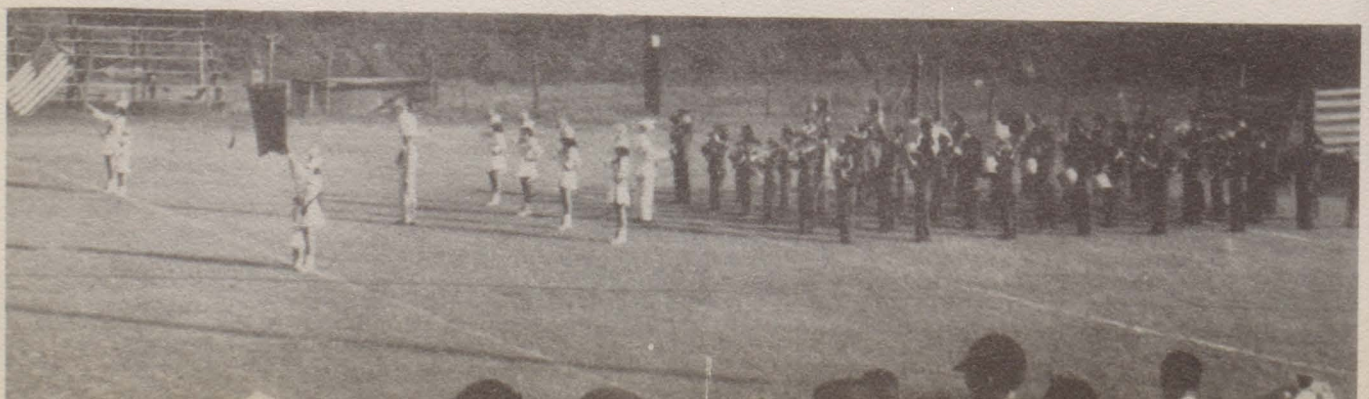

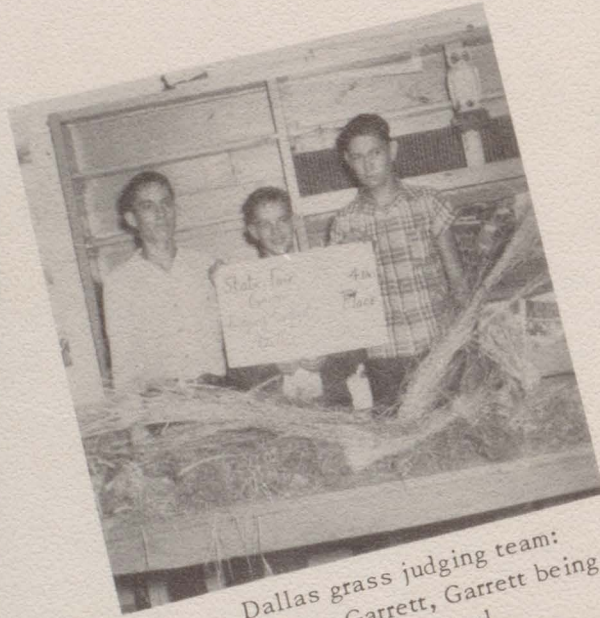
