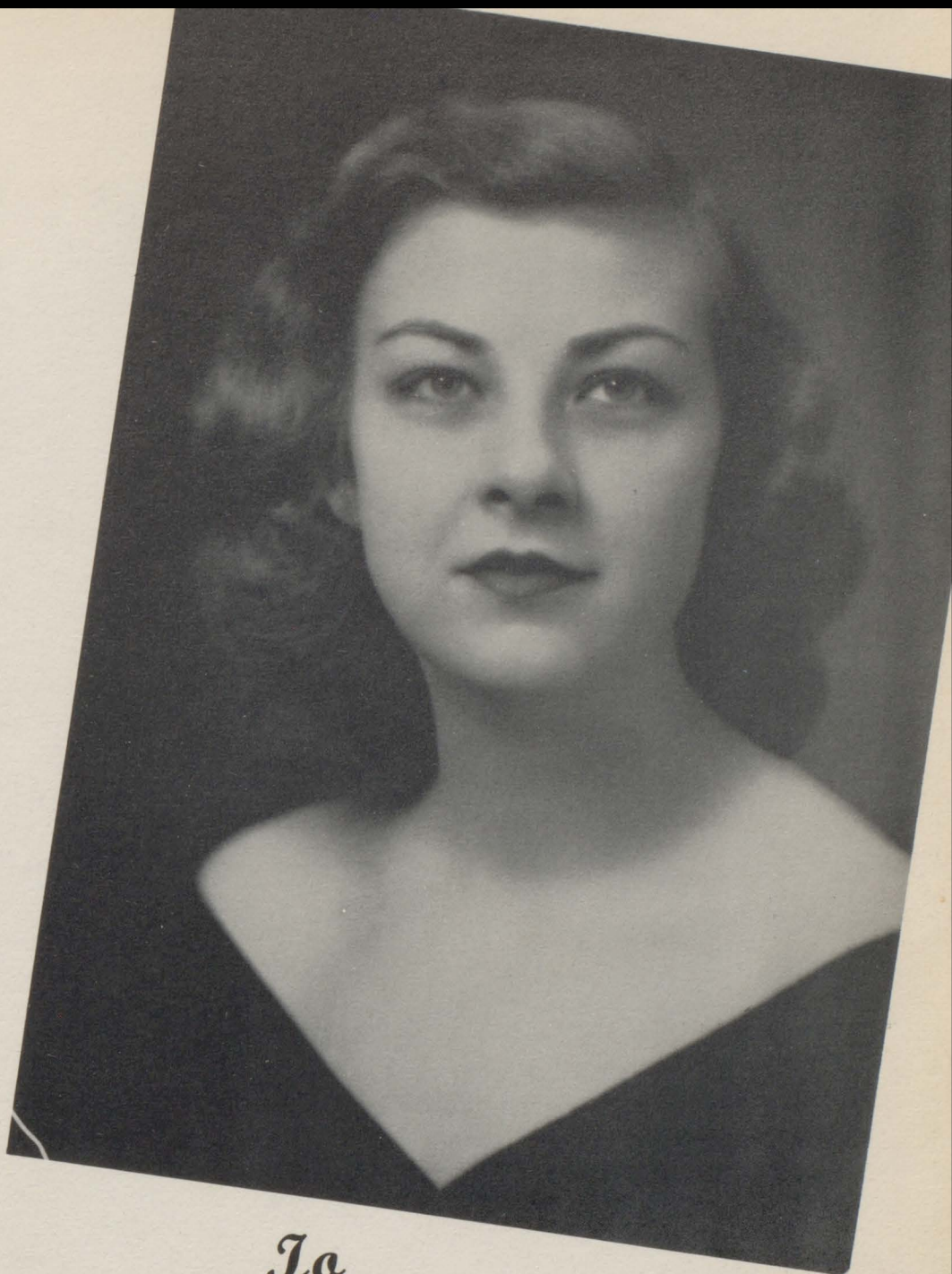


Our school is a combination of individual ideals built from the dreams and efforts of many people. For years many students have entered—each one leaving with new aspirations and increased wisdom.

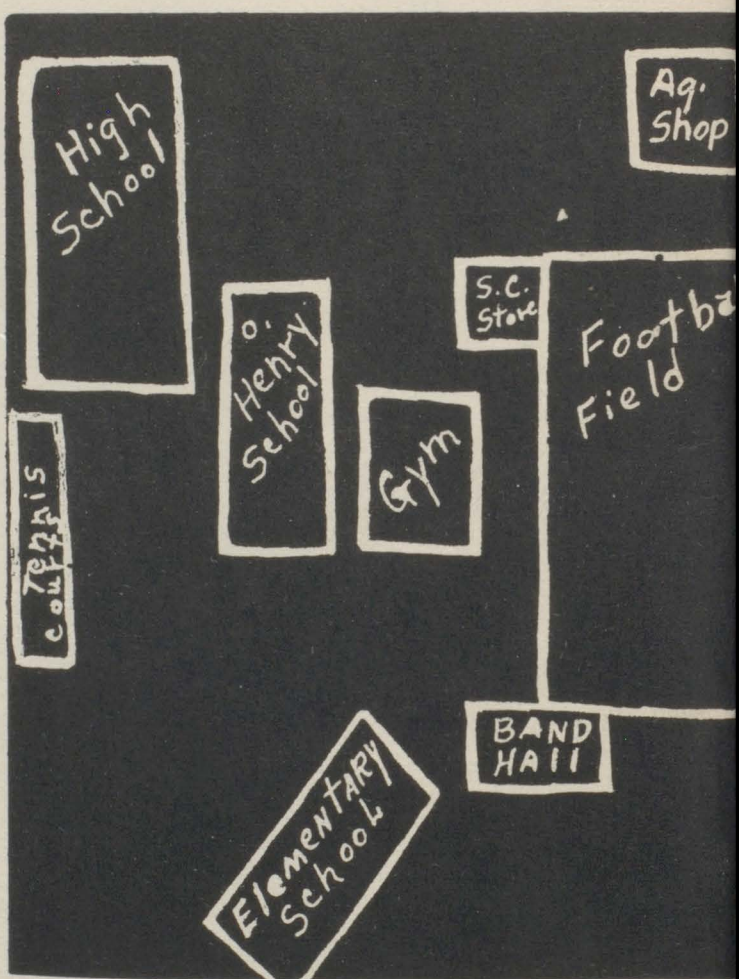

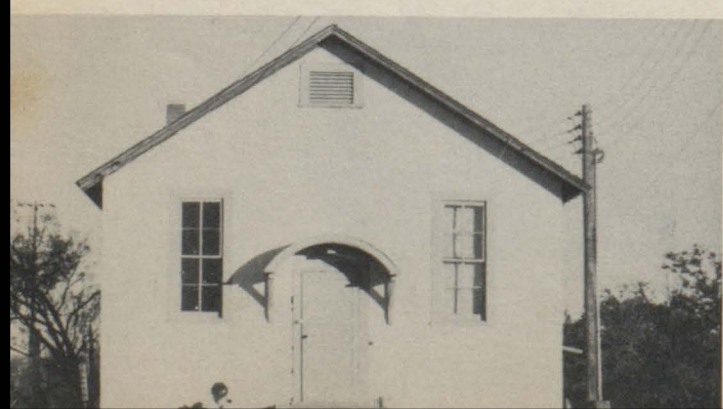

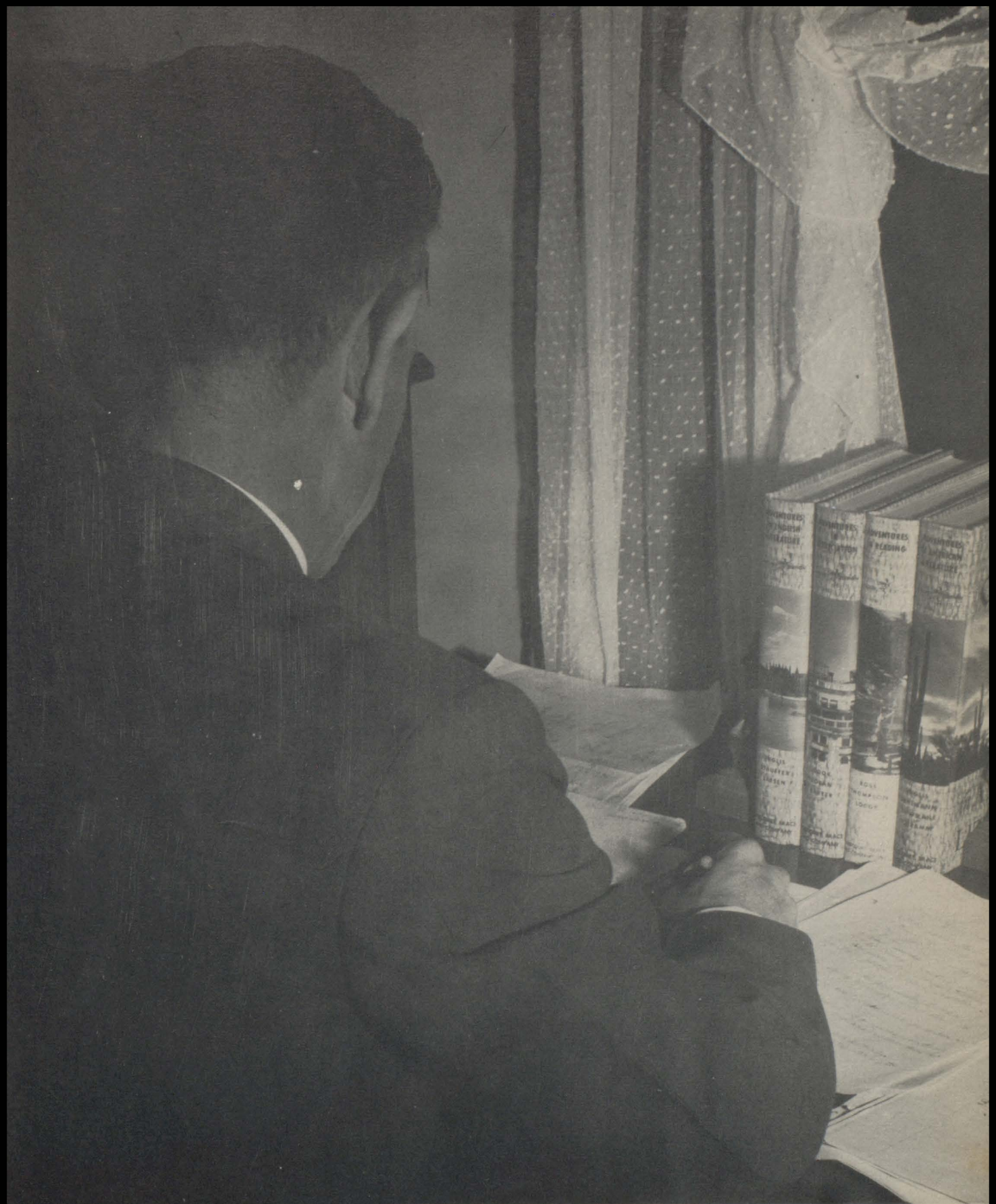

Superintendent's Message

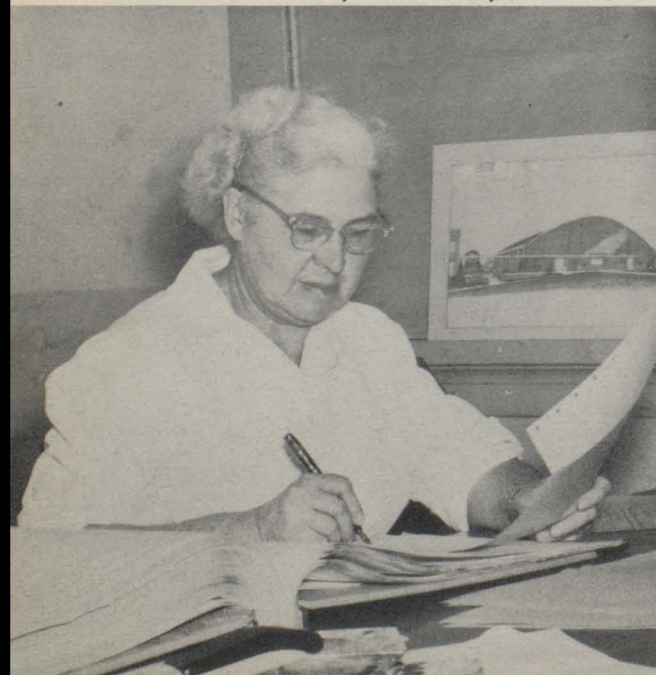
Students and Patrons of Llano Schools:
