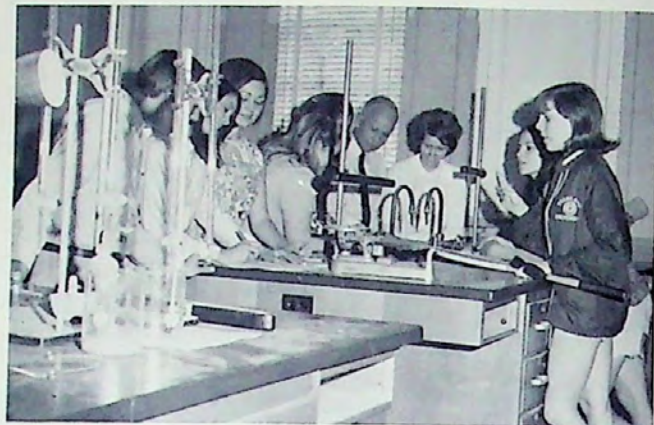

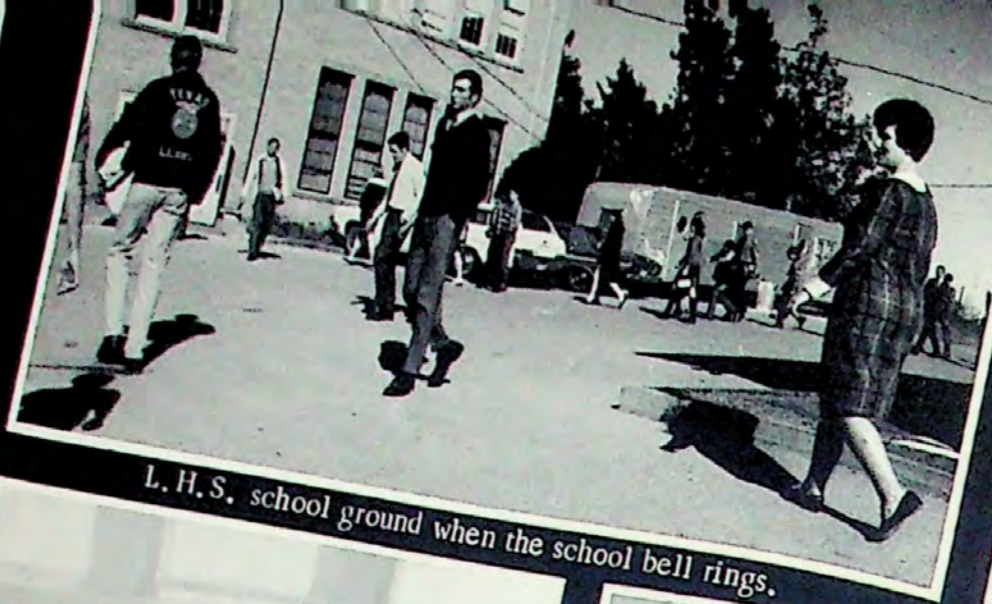

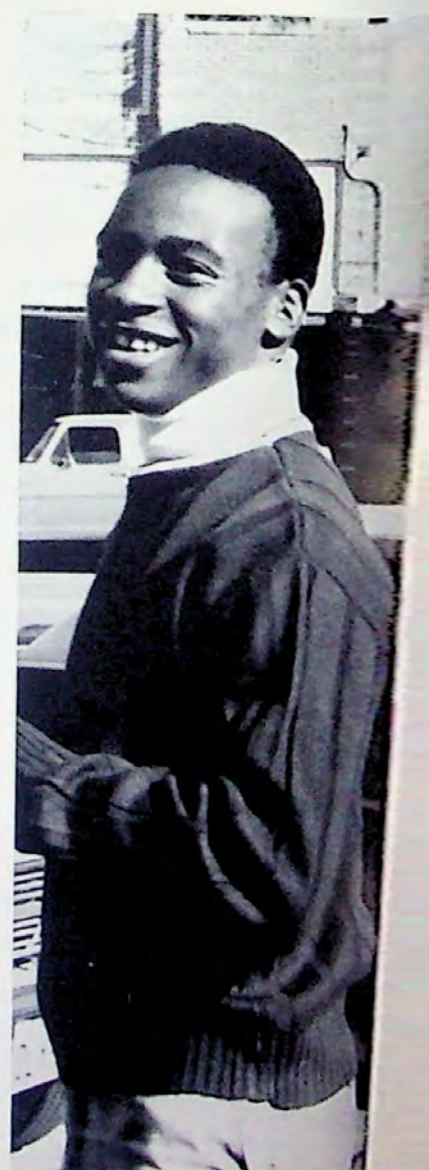

# LLANO PLACES SECOND IN DISTRICT UIL COMPETITION

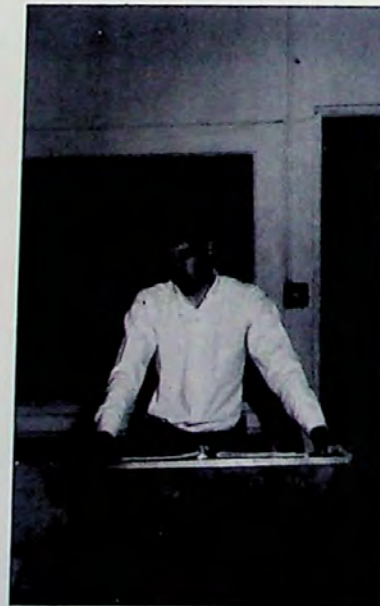

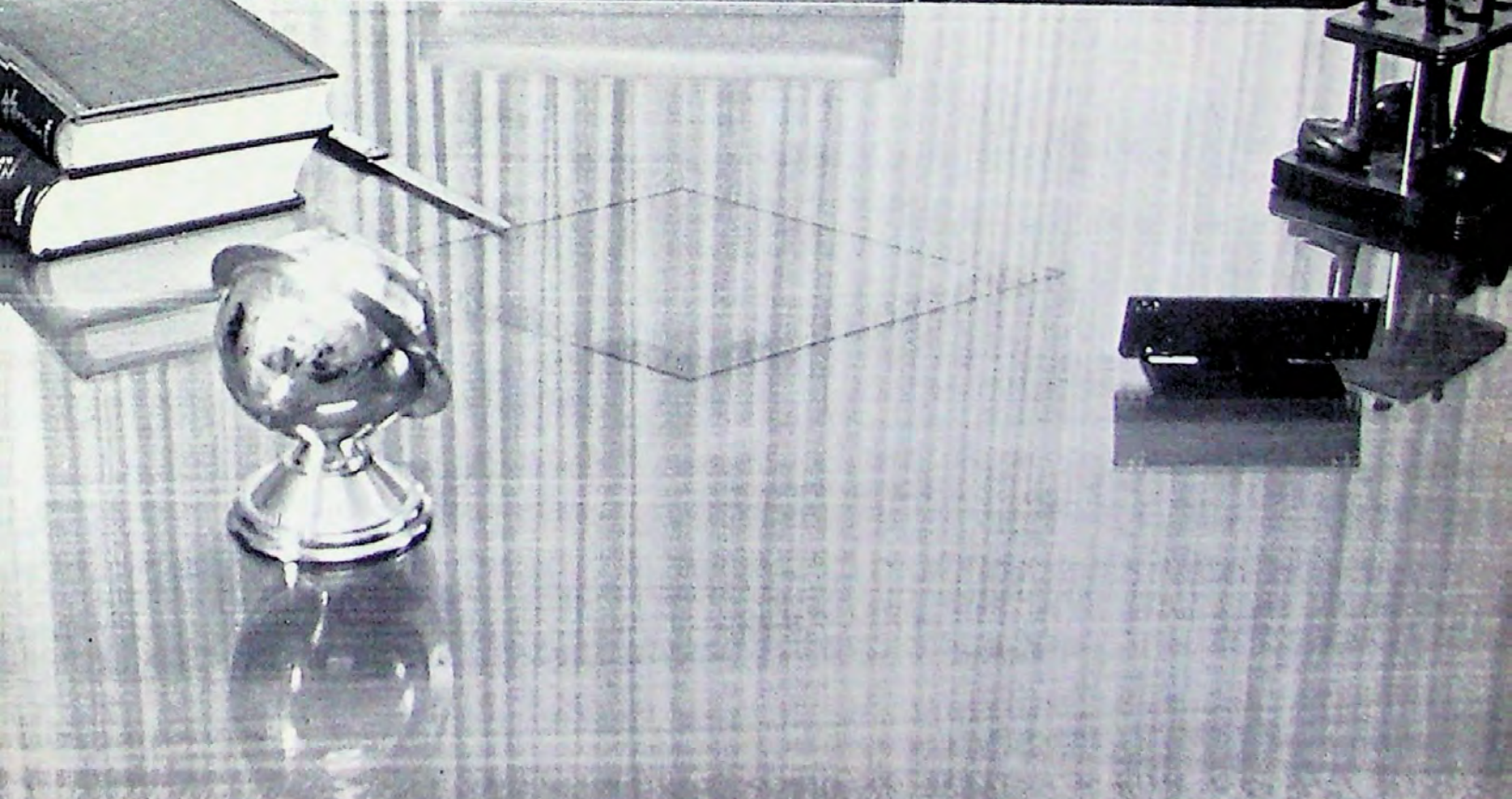

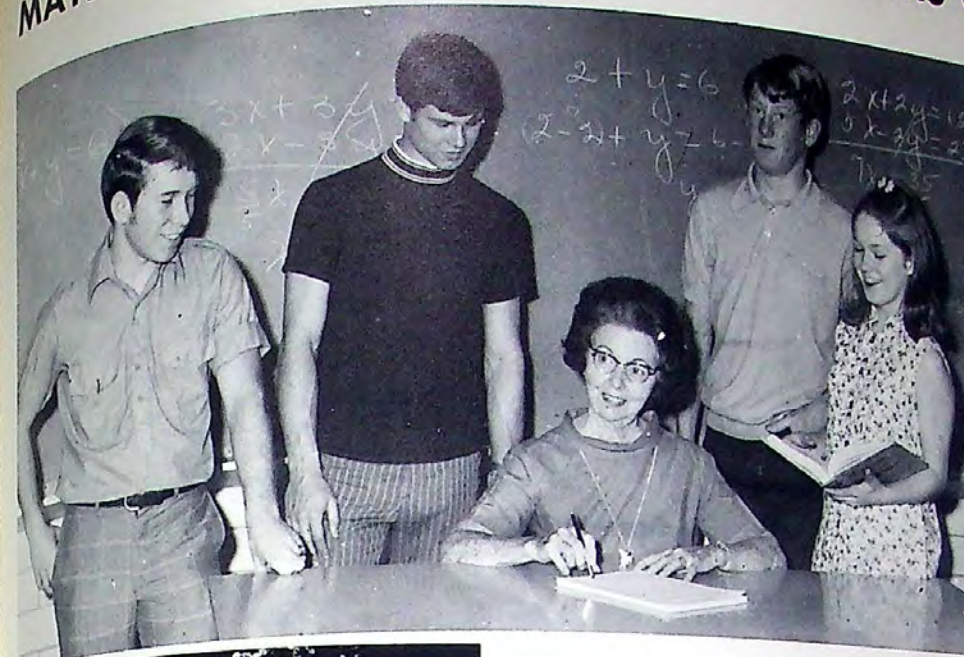
