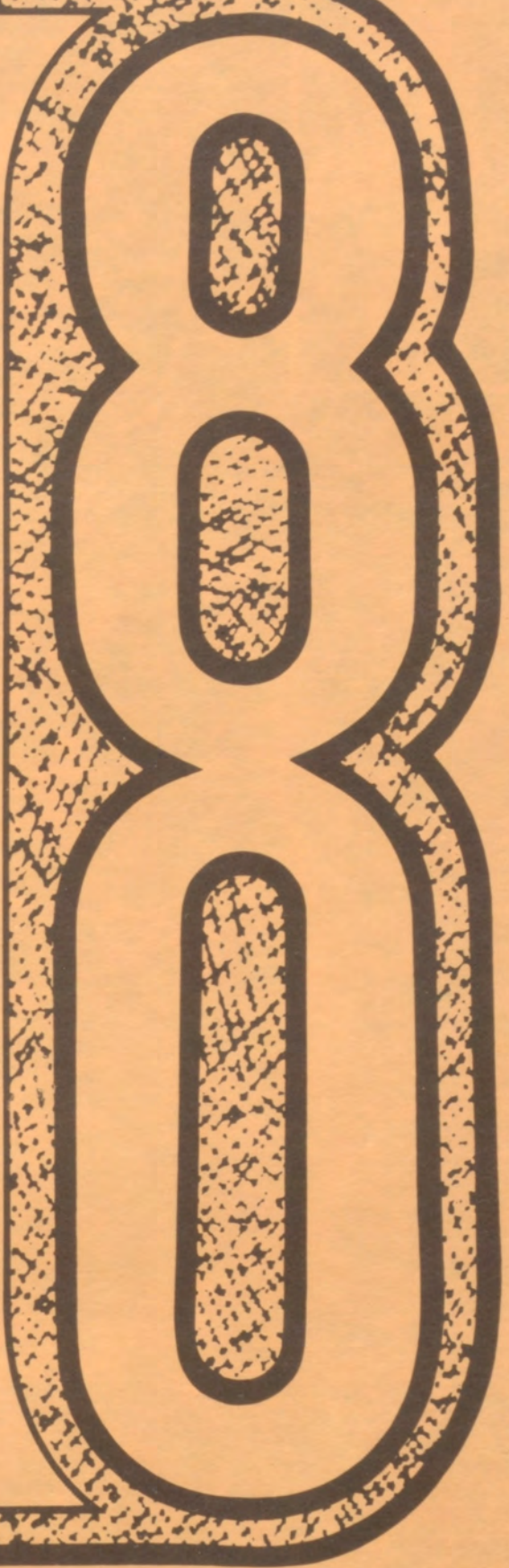


Fun For All: Guys & Girls??

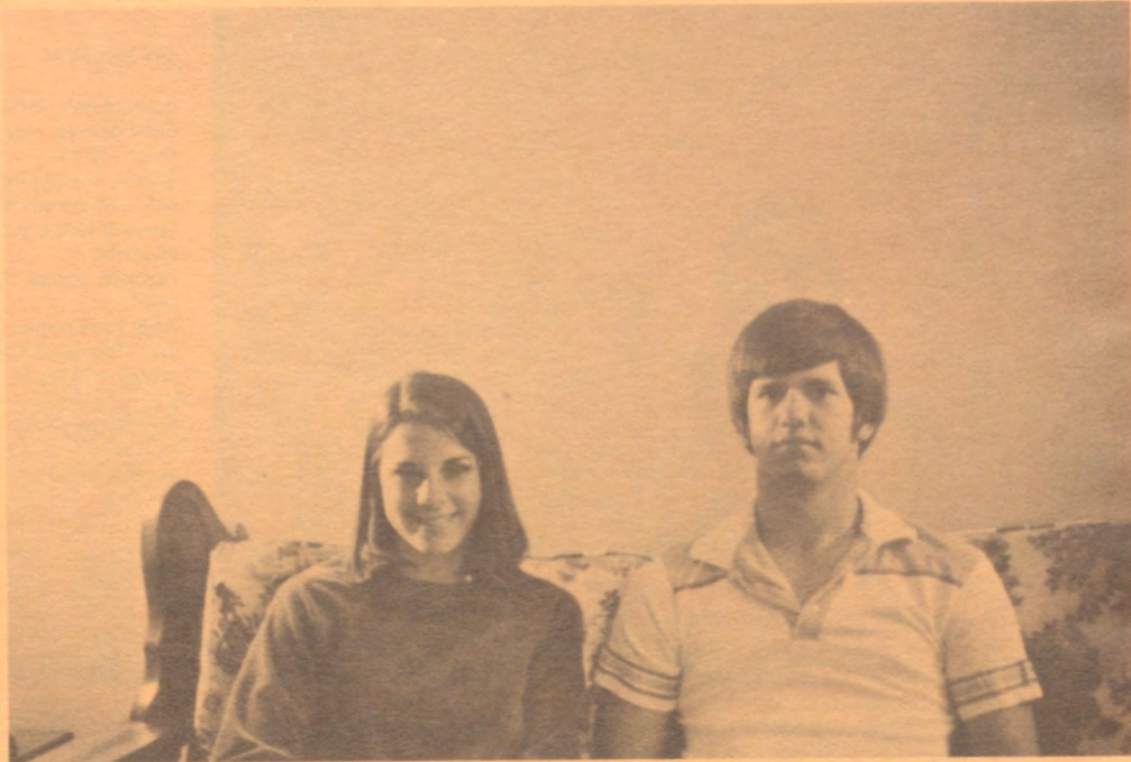

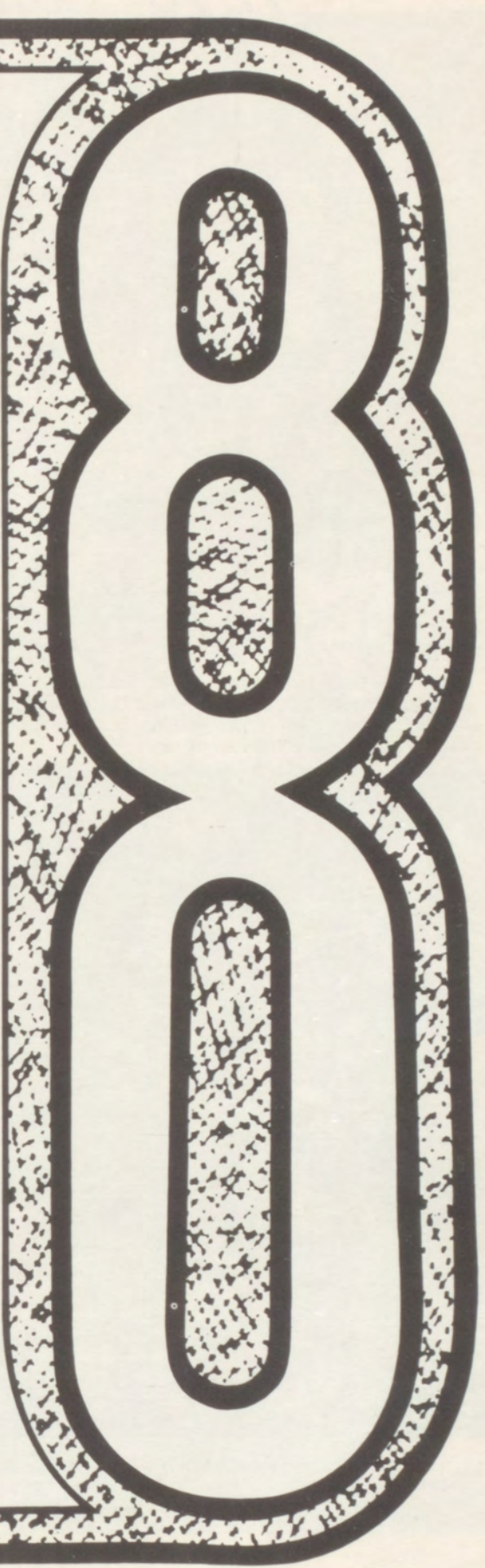

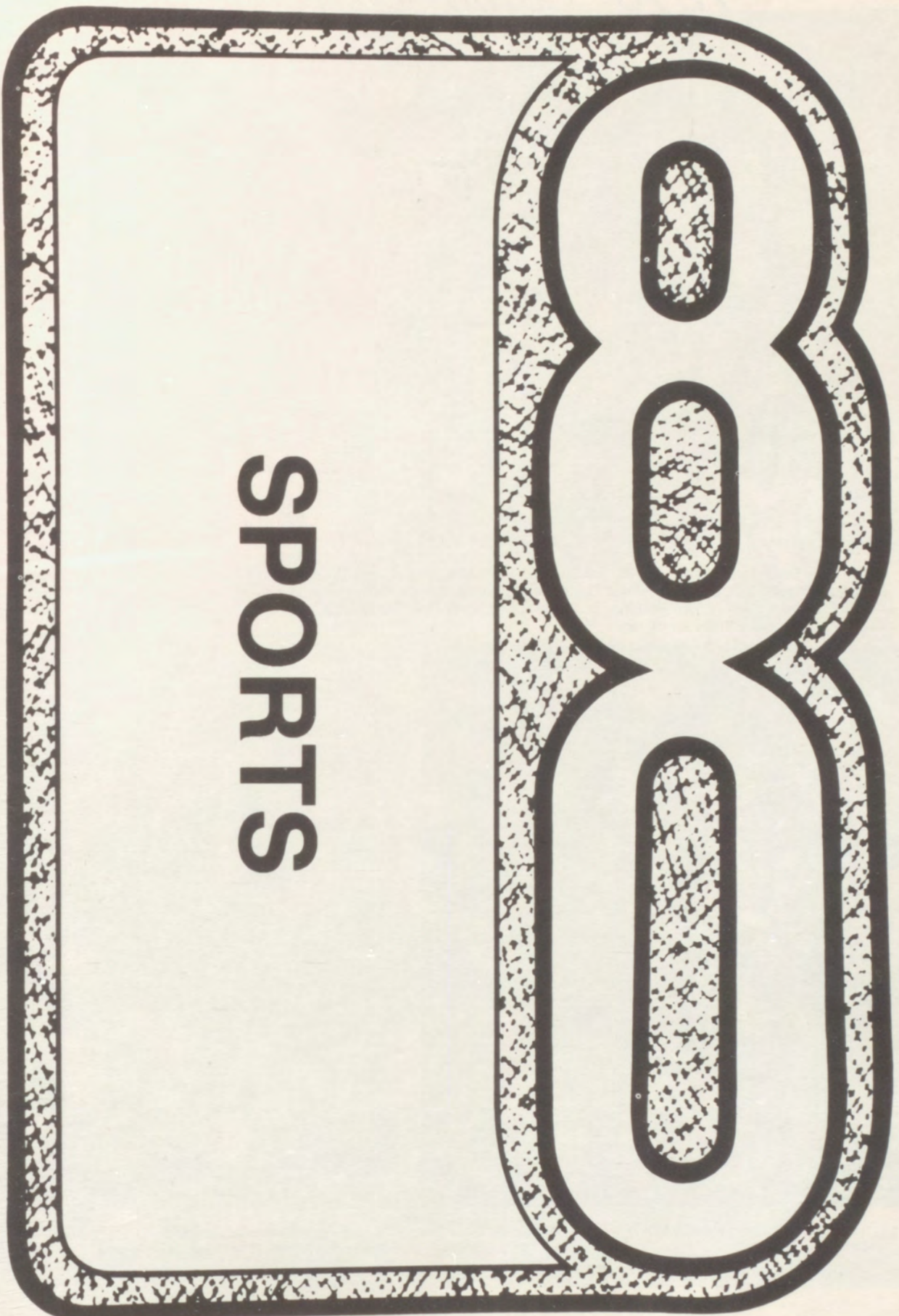

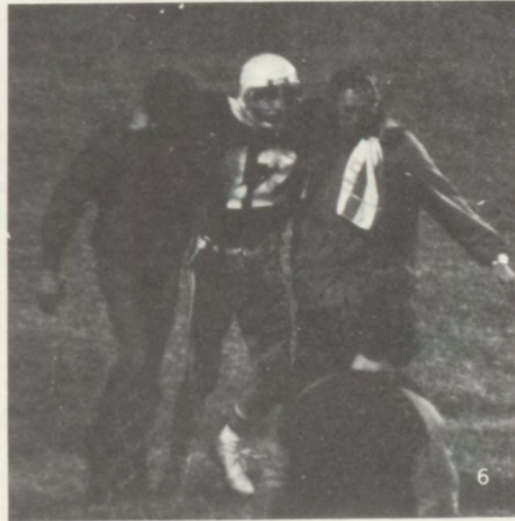

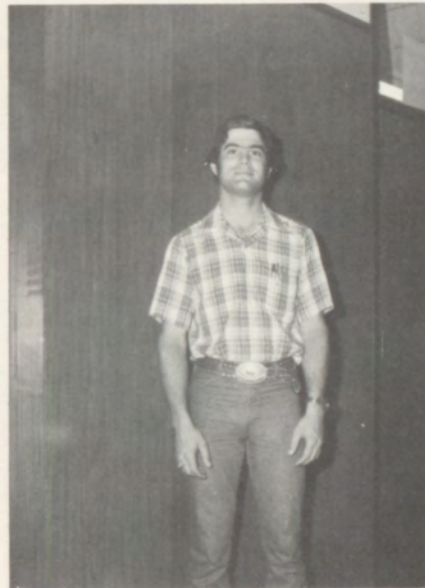
