CLOSE-UP PARTICIPANTS AND WINNERS GET ATTENTION

Fifteen students of Llano High School participated in a government program in Washington D.C. during the week of January 11-17, 1981. This gave students a chance to see Washington "close-up" and many exciting experiences were shared by all.

The trip was a learning session on government. Activities included seminars on lobbying, the Executive Branch, the Judicial Branch, international relations, defense policies, etc. Workshops were conducted on current issues, laws, the presidency, etc. Small group activities and discussions were held. Students even participated in C-SPAN and a PBS television program.

Our students met with Congressman Tom Loeffler of our 21st Congressional District. He personally answered our students' questions on energy, immigration, fuel, and new administrative policies.

Many current activities were in action. The inauguration of Ronald Reagan as President, the hostage question, the Haig confirmation hearing, and the Martin Luther King Rally.

Historically, the students visited the Capitol, Supreme Court, Smithsonian buildings, Library of Congress, National Archives, White House and all the monuments. Many of the students traveled to the Pentagon.

It was an exciting and fast-paced trip which was well enjoyed by all, and a trip to be remembered for a lifetime. Since LHS students were allowed to participate in 1981, it is likely they will be allowed to participate annually.



Chris Immel was selected as a semi-finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Competition by scoring a 1,290 on the test and a selection index of 190.

Over 1,000,000 took the test. There were 15,000 semi-finalists and there will be 4,500 finalists.

The Llano Chapter of American Legion selected, Sabas Najjar and Kelly Gilbert to attend Boys State during the summer of 1980.

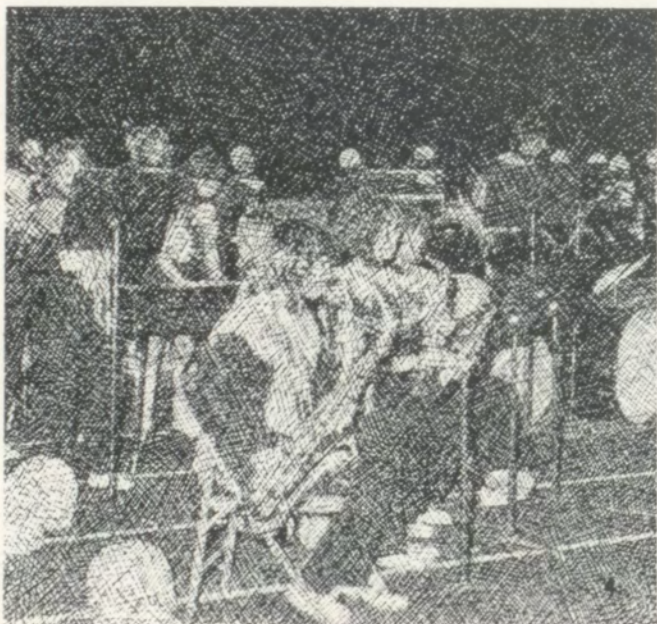

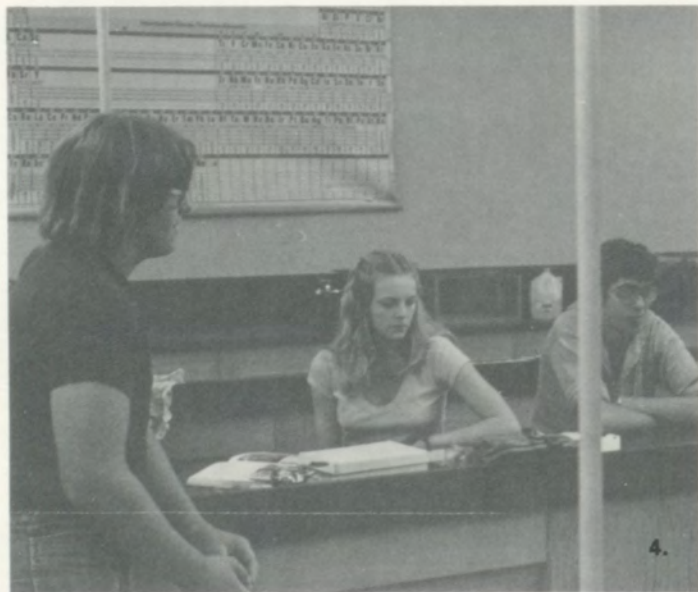

The maintenance personnel made Llano High look like a fine school, which it is. Their duties consisted of changing lights to fixing broken articles. The school could not do without them.



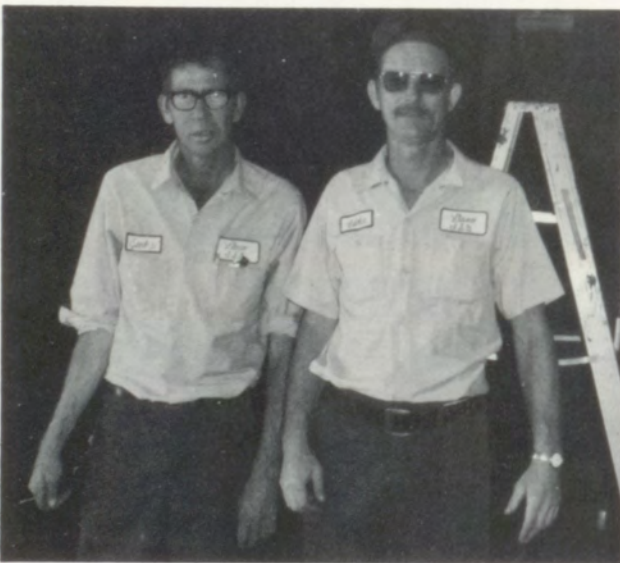

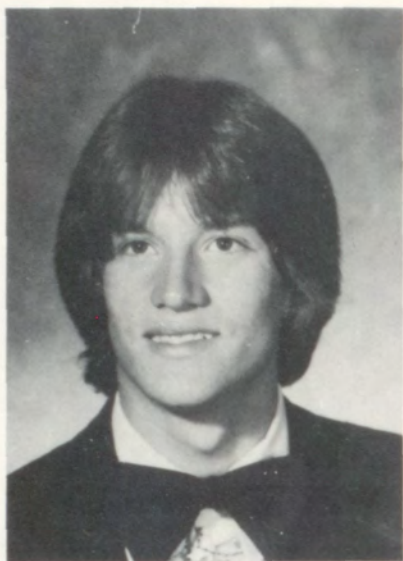

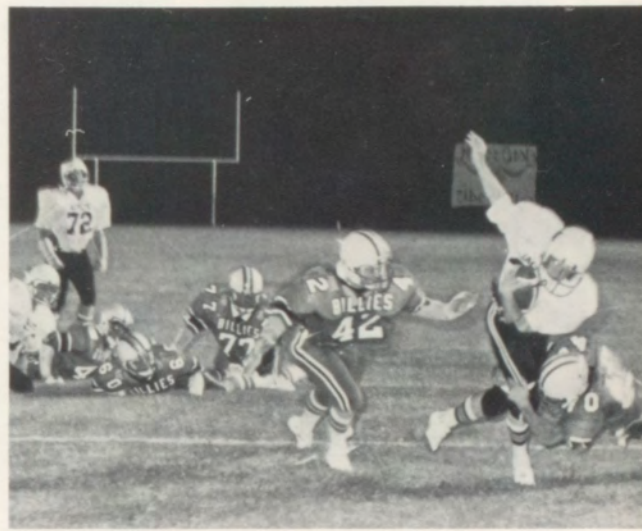

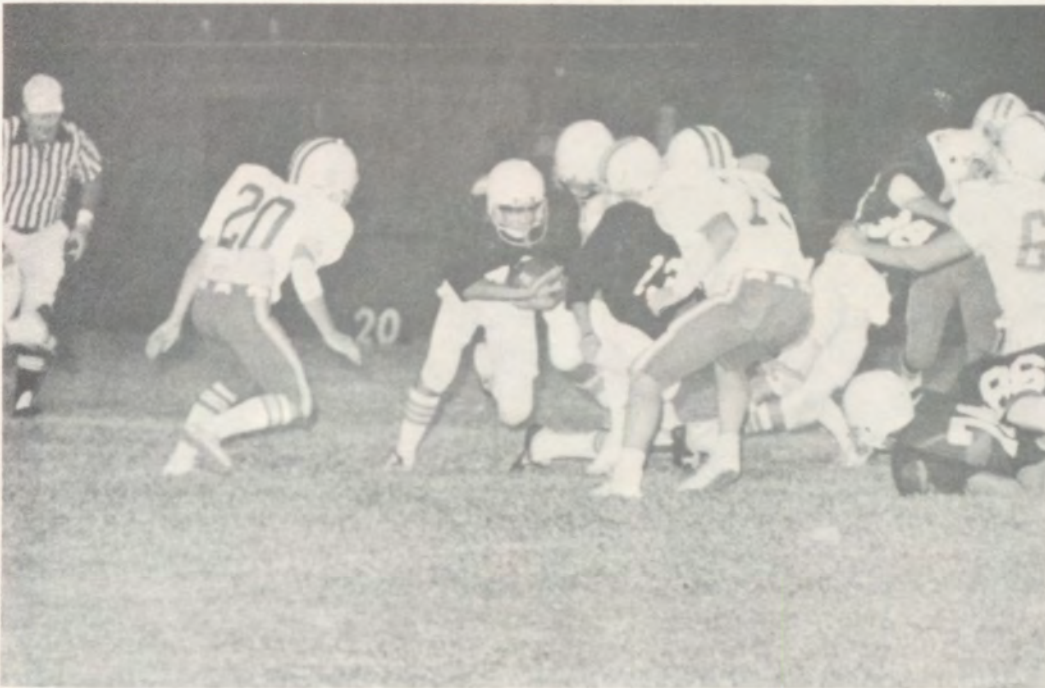

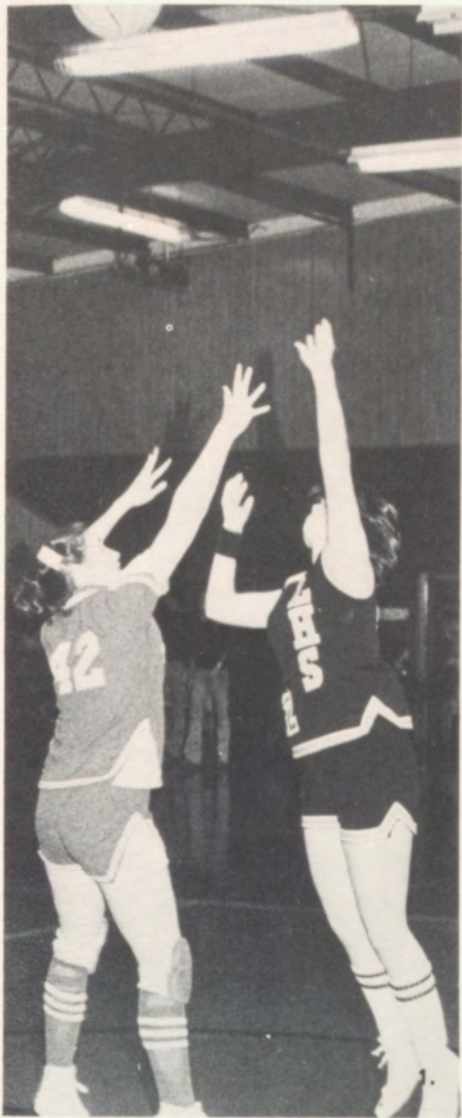

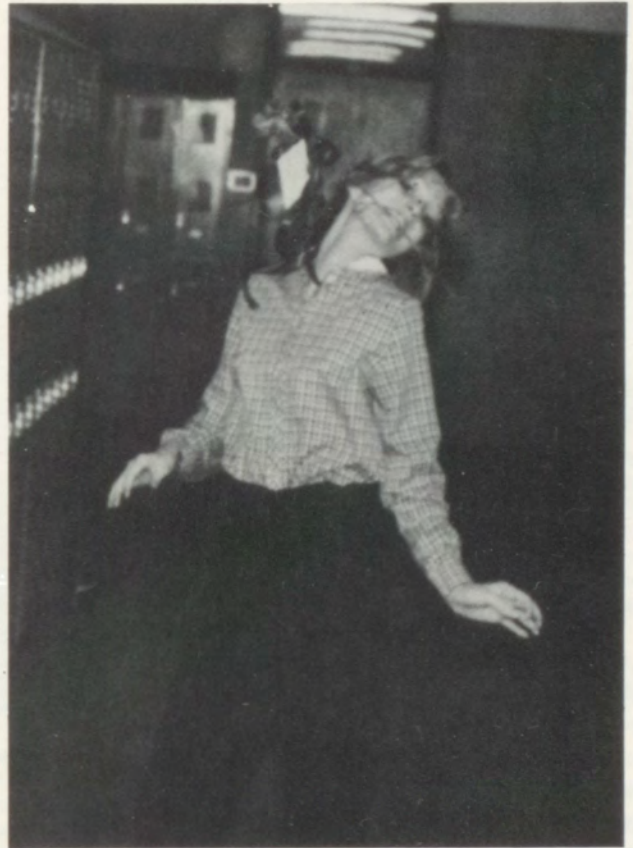

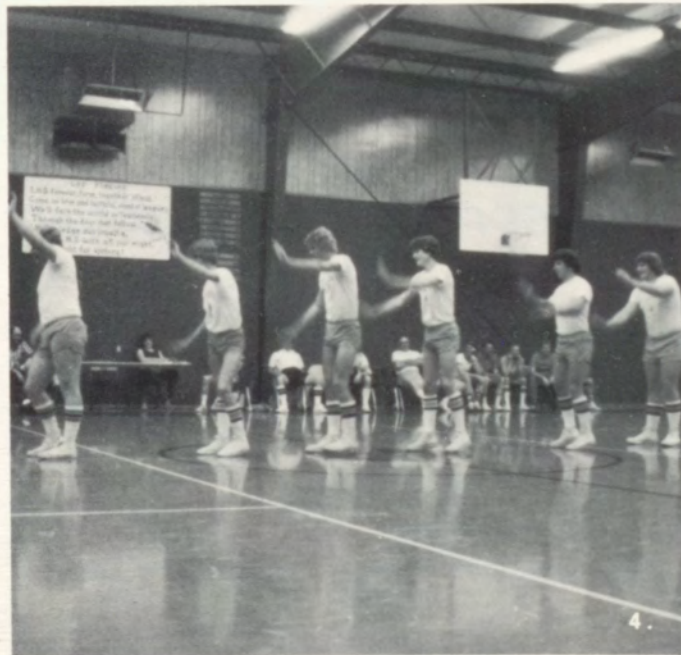
