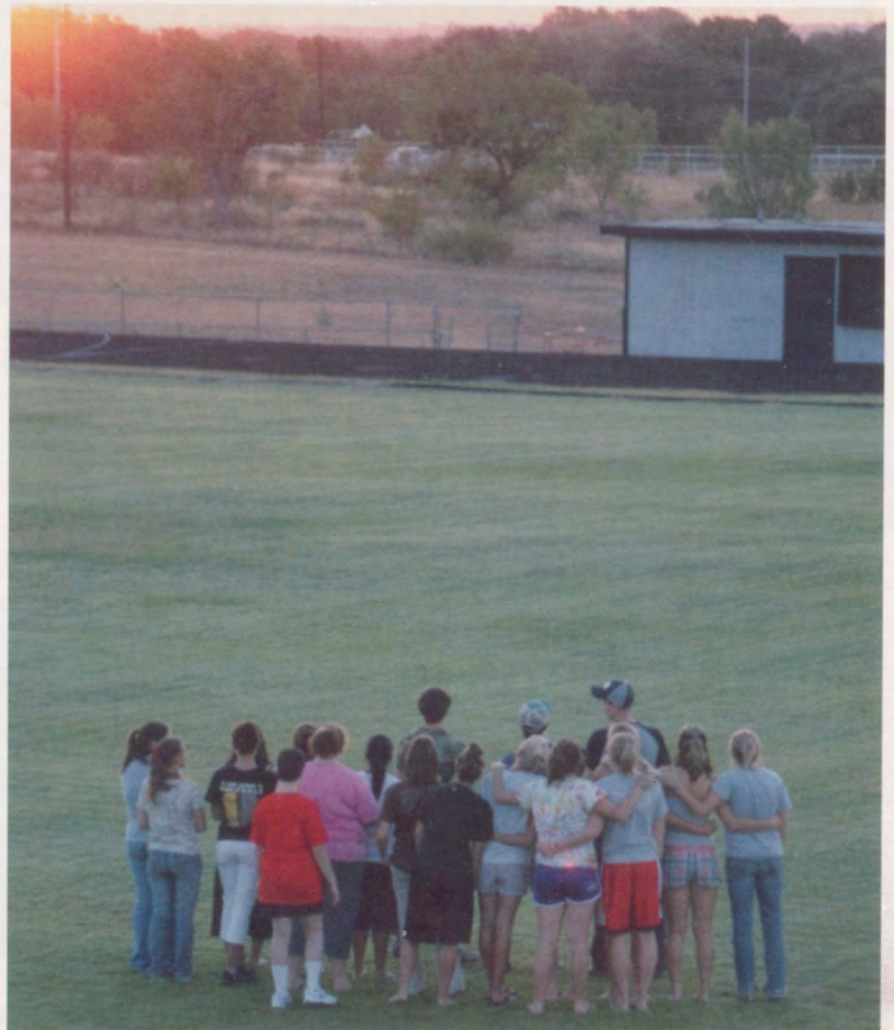

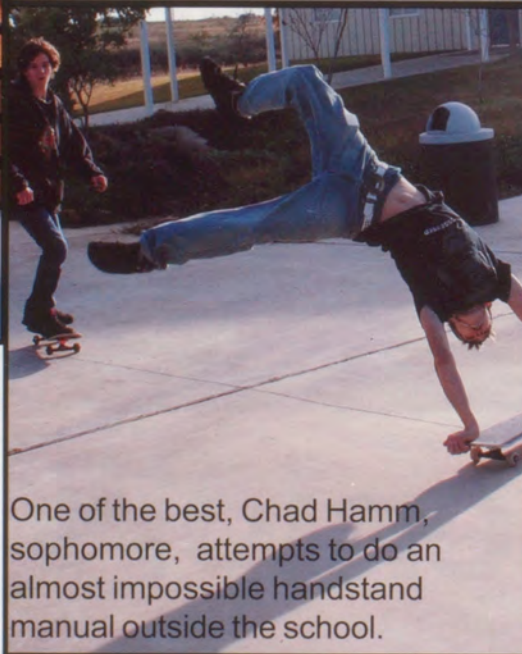

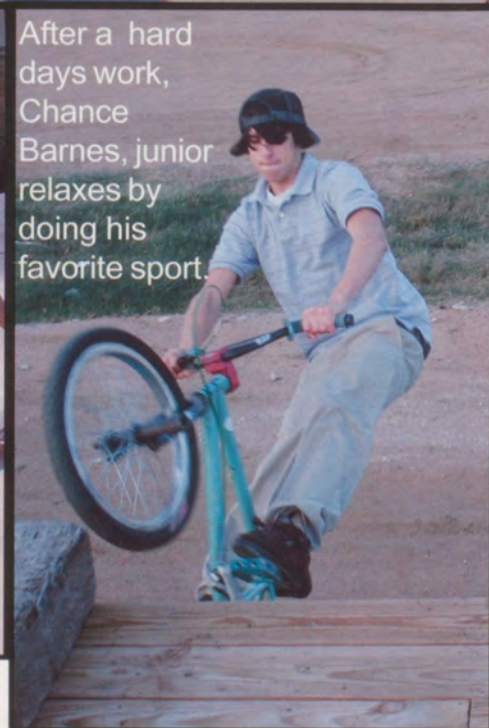

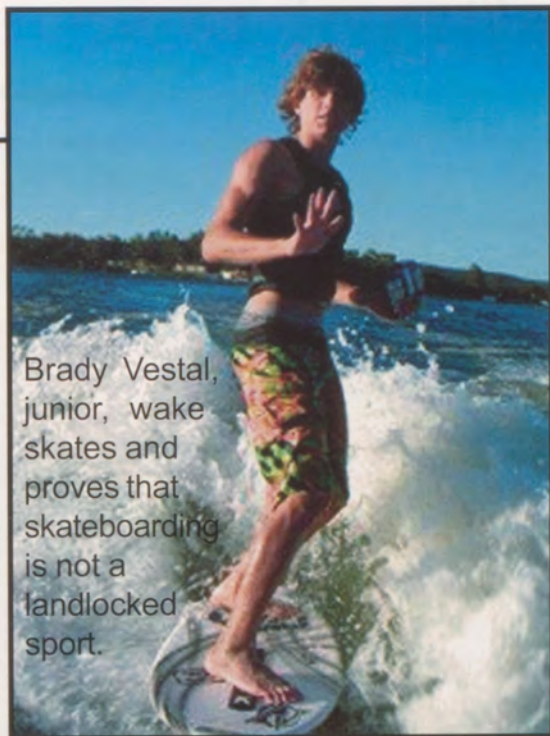

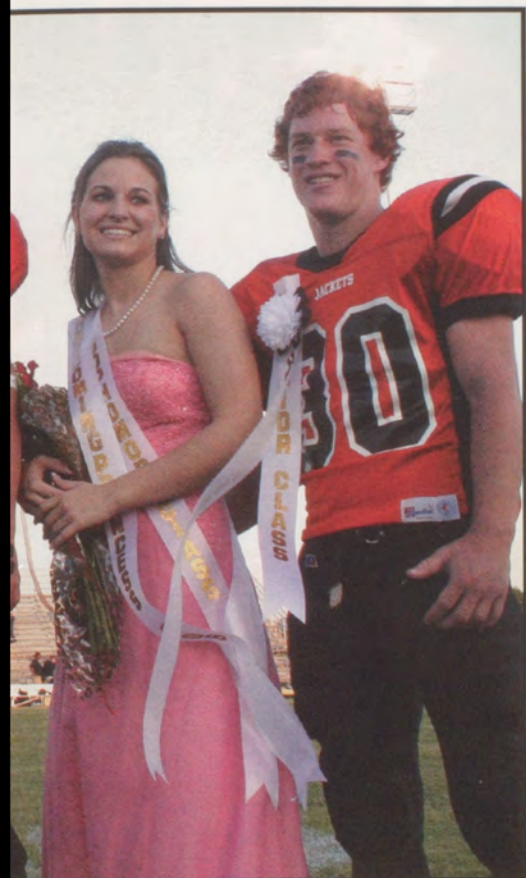

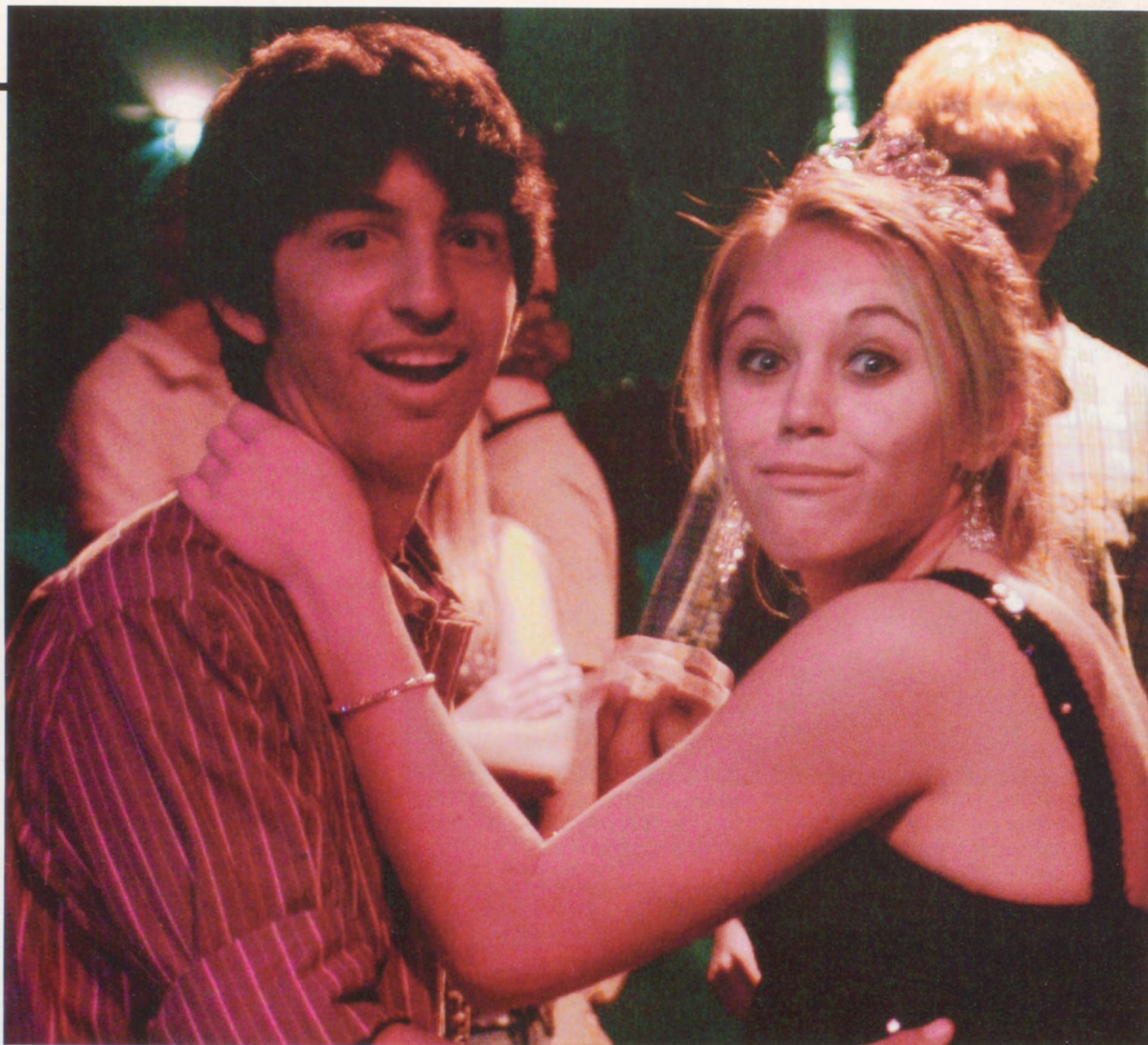

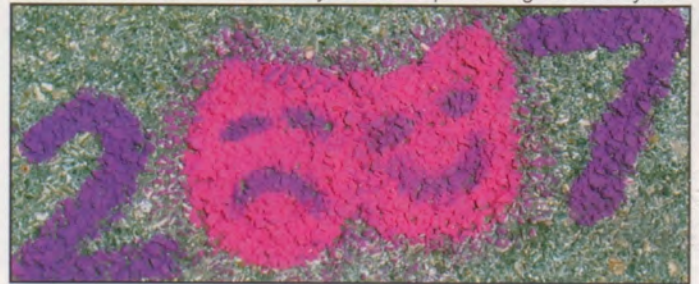

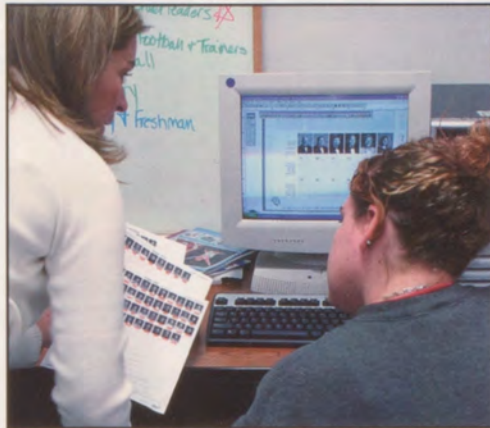

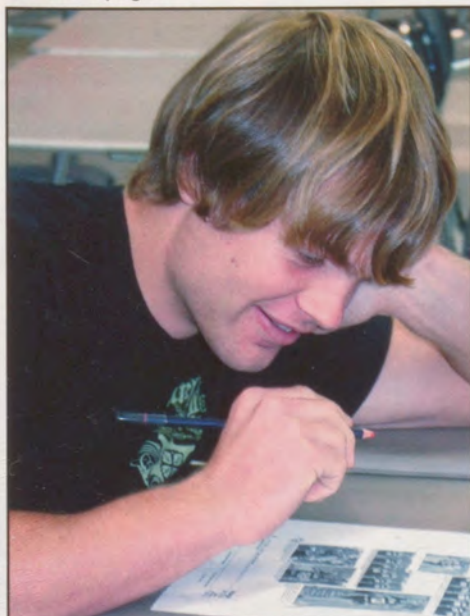

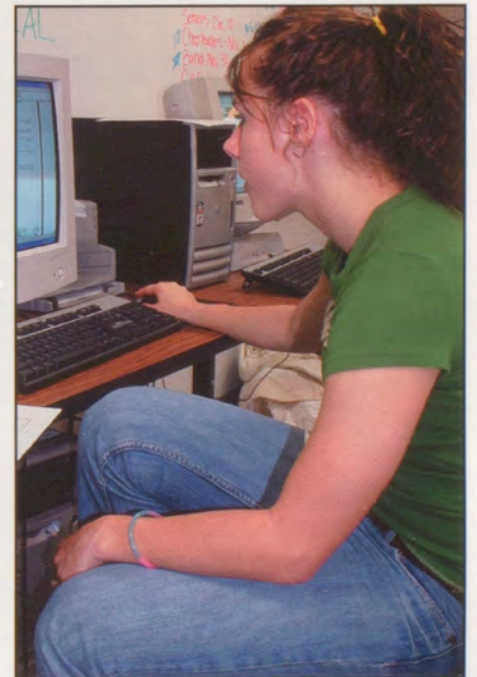

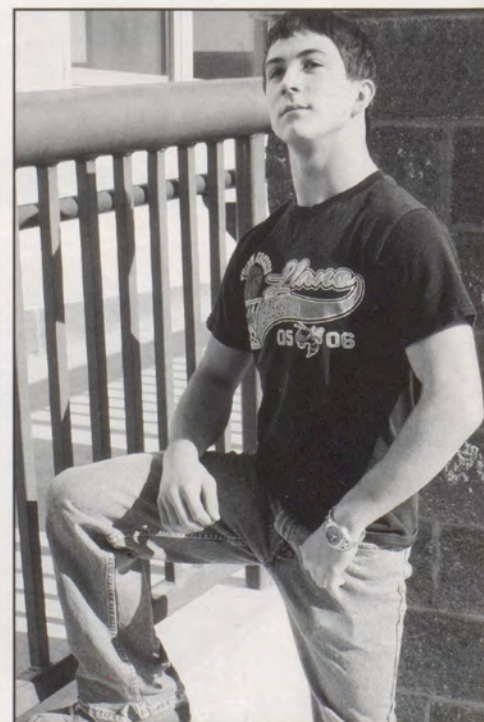

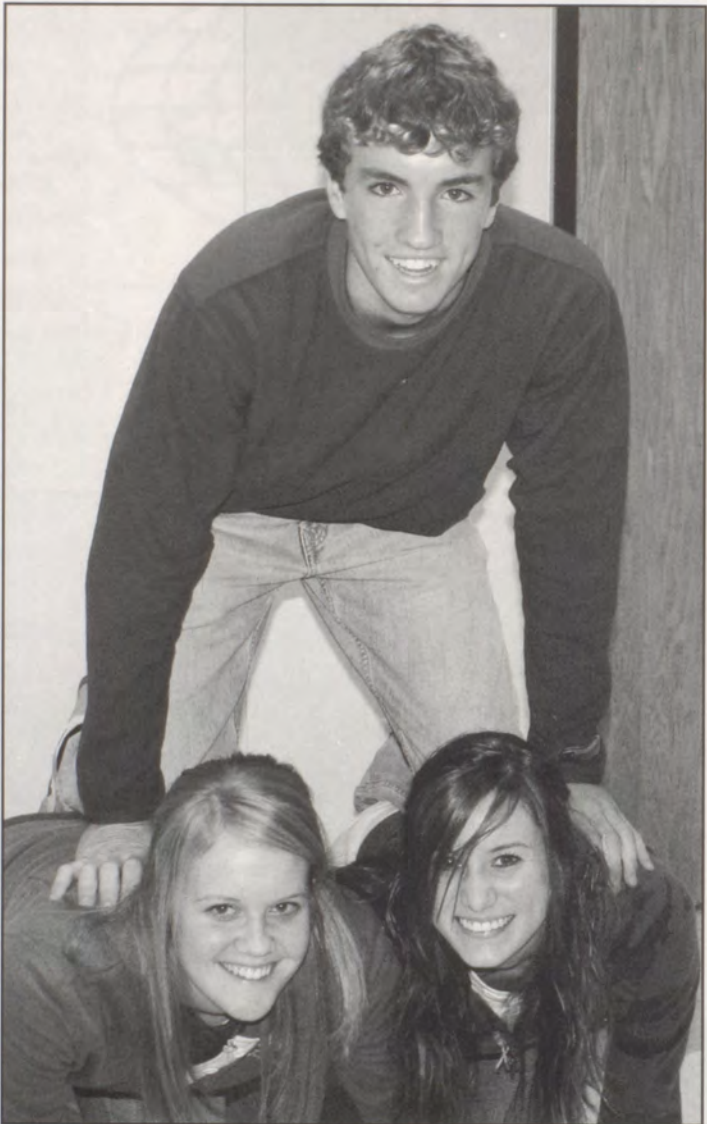
# Sophomores

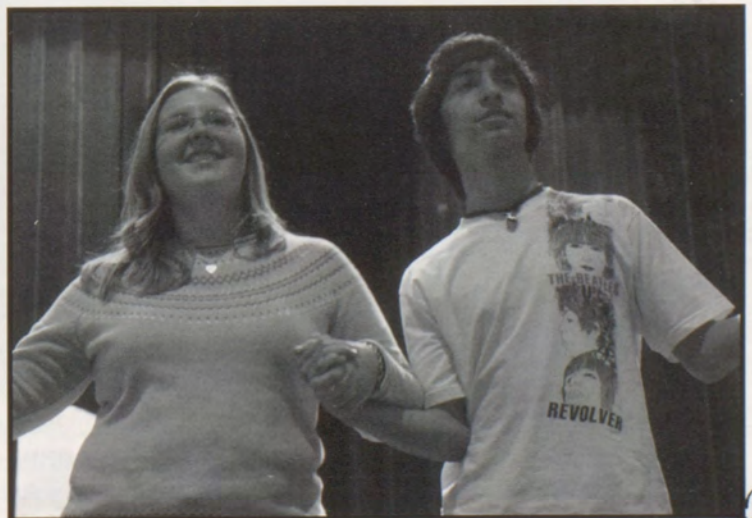

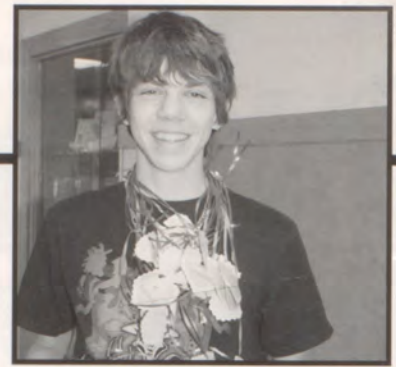

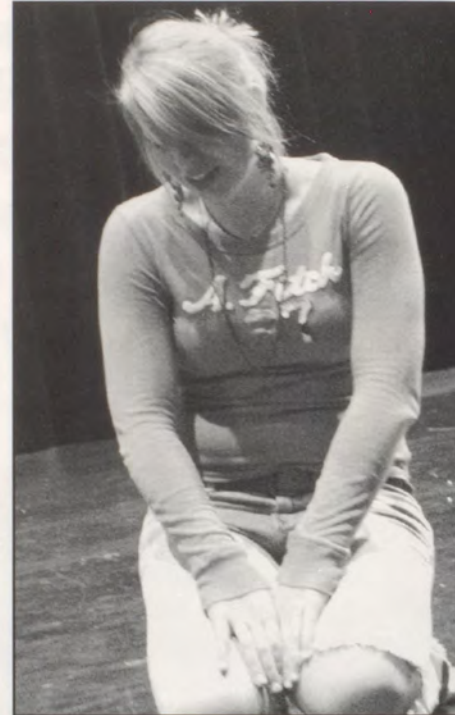

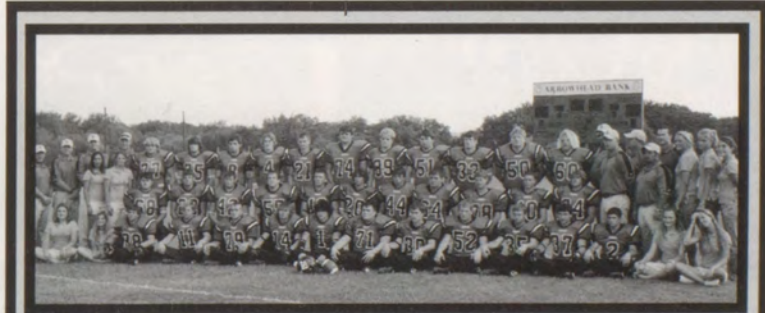

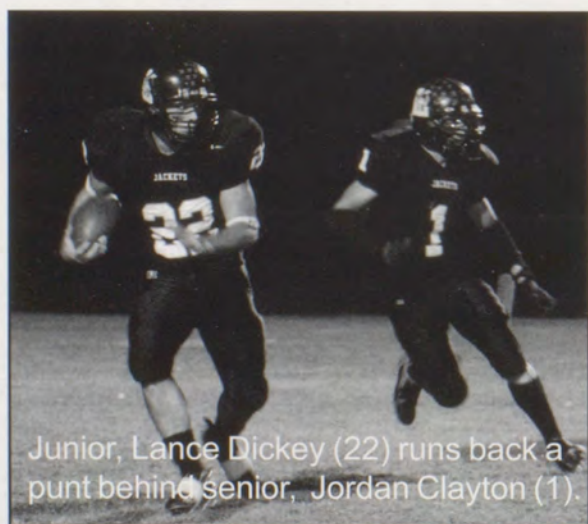

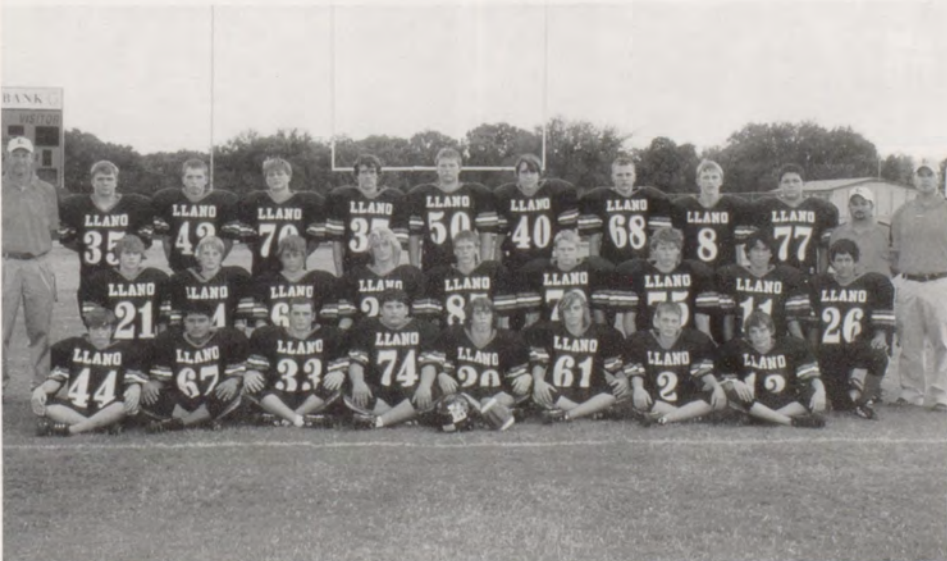

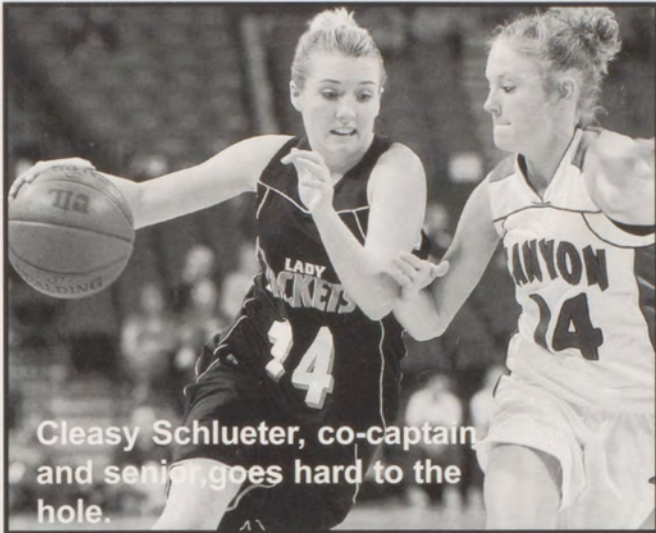

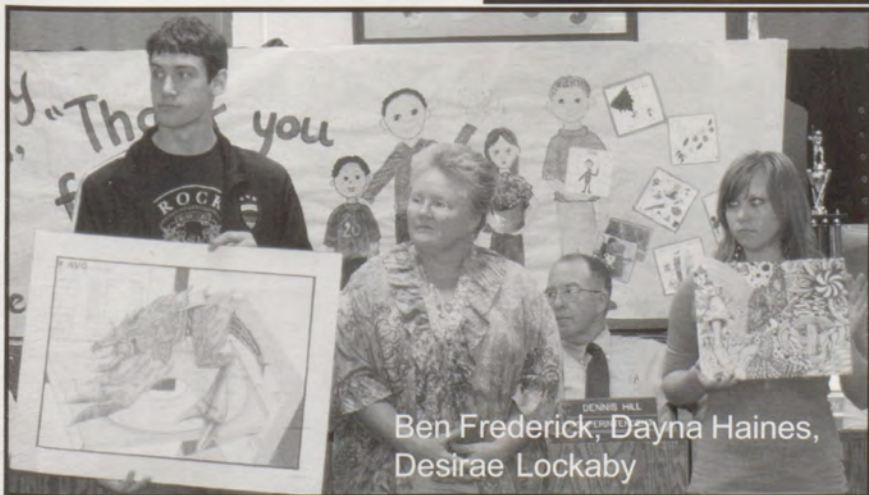
# STATE Champs

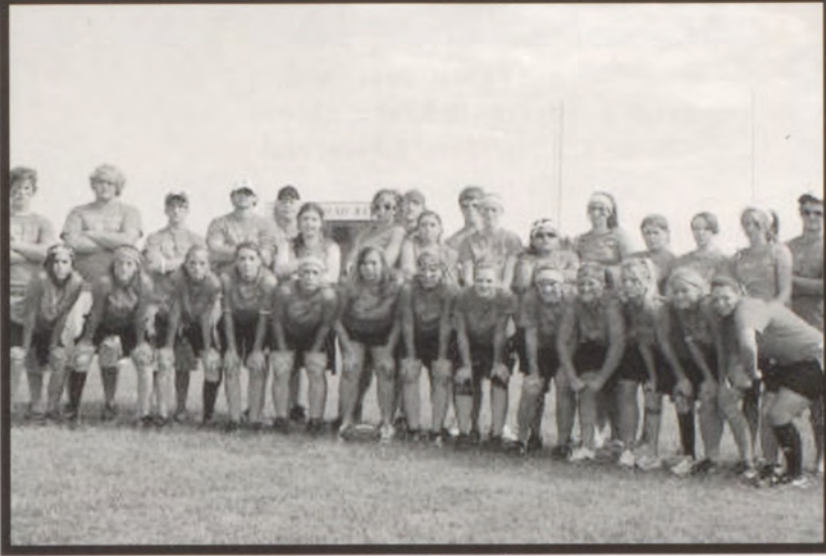
