D. Name of Ancestor Vada William Clearman

Vada William Clearman was born in Kingsland, Llano County, Texas August 23, 1896. Her parents were Walter William Clearman and Marguerite Catherine Leapart, both Kingsland residents and members of the First Christian Church. Vada attended the Public School in Kingsland as an adolescent and teenager. As a young woman before marriage, she worked as an operator for the Kingsland Rural Telephone Co. in the central switch board office. Her father, Walter, operated the company and also served as the company lineman. Walter "rode the lines" on horseback as he inspected the system. The telephone office was located on a narrow road which is now known as Selman Street.

Vada had three younger siblings (all girls) who were: Leta Mae "Dick" (born in Kingsland); Alta Van (born in Kingsland) and Ollie Lea (born in Waldo, TX). Ollie Lea is living today (1996) in the old Walter William Clearman homestead also on Selman Street.

April 30, 1917, Vada, 21, married Hubert William Hill, 20, a Kingslander, in Lubbock, Texas where they lived for a short time. The urge to return to Kingsland prevailed and husband, Hubert, began his business career. On March 21, 1918 her first child, Dorman William Hill, was born. Another year passed, then the three Hills moved to nearby Llano in 1919.

Hubert's business enterprises were successful and this allowed Vada to become a full time mother and housewife. The Hills were prospering in Llano when Vada's second child, Marguerite Karolyn Hill was born on October 27, 1921. The family's good fortune continued through the 1920's and well into the early 1930's. Vada and her family lived in a neat white home on the old route of Texas Highway 29. The house continues to stand (in 1996) at the same spot on what is now known as 602 Ellis Street.

The early 1930's also brought on strained family matters that finally reached a point of collapse. The result was the pain of a 1932 divorce. Vada and Marguerite continued to live in Llano until the end of the 1935/1936 school year. This was the year following the infamous 1935 Flood that destroyed the old Llano River Bridge.

In July 1936, Vada "pulled up stakes" and moved to Austin to begin a new life with Marguerite. Dorman, now 18, was living in Austin and working for Brown & Root constructing the Marshall Ford Dam (renamed Mansfield Dam) on the Colorado River near Austin. Vada secured employment as a housemother in the Copeland Houses which were approved housing for The University of Texas male students. Marguerite attended and graduated from Austin High School prior to entering The University as a Freshman in September 1939.

The following year in the late summer of 1940, Marguerite, now 18, was preparing for her Sophomore fall semester. Dorman, 22, was secure in his construction job with Brown & Root (he retired from B & R as a division manager after 45 years). In September 1940, Marguerite moved in to live with her older cousin, Juanita Duncan, to pursue her BS degree in Home Economics. Jaunita was an Austin Independent School District administrator who lived in an apartment on Congress Avenue about two blocks north of the state capital. With the fate of the children settled, Vada, 44, moved to San Antonio to be near her sister "Dick" and to work as a woman clothier.

In early 1943, Vada met Ira David Harris from Wichita, Kansas. They were married September 25, 1943 in San Antonio. She was 47 and he was 58. They continued to live in San Antonio where Ira was a master cabinet maker until 1952 when he retired. Subsequently, family ties drew them to Houston where Vada's children lived.

Ira D. Harris passed away on June 29, 1968 in The Herman Hospital, Houston, Texas at the age of 83. He was buried in the Kingsland Cemetery on Ranch Road 2545. Vada continued to live in Houston, Dallas and Kingsland during the next decade and at the age of 89 died on April 03, 1985 in Cleveland, Texas. Vada William Clearman Harris was buried next to Ira David Harris in the Kingsland Cemetery.

D. Name of Ancestor OLLIE LEA CLEARMAN

This period found the Clearmans moving to the family's new and present homestead on what is now called Selman St., it was 1918. Two years later Ollie Lea was sixteen and attended the first of many dances at the Longhorn Cavern, more than a decade before the present entrance steps were constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps during the great depression of the 1930's. She and her friends had to climb down a hole through limestone boulders to get to the dance floor. She said, "it was worth all the trouble, we had great string and brass bands that played popular dance music".

In 1920, her mother, Maggie, passed away. She was still sixteen, so Walter, her dad, had to spend a lot of time with her. They spent many leisure hours fishing and camping on the Llano River. She thought, till the day she passed away, she was the expert on how to fish and where the best fishing holes were. Her favorite saying was, "if the wind is out of the east, they bite the least. If the wind is out of the west, they bite the best".

In 1922, Ollie Lea was eighteen and a very experienced switchboard operator who helped her dad at the office, now located next to their home, on the night shift.

Ollie Lea left for Tyler Business School in 1923. She finished her schooling and returned home to Kingsland to help her dad till he retired in 1926.

On February 5, 1927, she married Manson T. Haile, son of Jeff D. Haile, also of Kingsland, in Brackenridge, Texas. They started their married life in Borger, Texas where their first child was born, a son, Garnett C. on July 30, 1928. They soon moved to Sunray, Texas for a while and then to Dumas, Texas where their second child was born, a daughter, Donna Jan on December 8, 1931

Ollie Lea's training on the switchboard paid off at start of World War II. She went to work at the Cactus Ordinance Plant in Dumas, as a PBX and Teletype operator.

D. Name of Ancestor OLLIE LEA CLEARMAN

In 1945, they moved to San Antonio, Texas, Manson soon went to work as construction pipefitter and would require a lot of travelling. They travelled from Texas to the northeast states. In the late 1960's, they moved to Bloomington, Texas where Manson was employed by Brown & Root in Seadrift, Texas.

They returned to Kingsland as often as possible to finish the restoration of the old Clearman homestead, started in 1947, along with Ollie Lea's sister, Dick and her husband, A. D.. They lived in Kingsland while Ollie Lea and Manson were working away from home. They retired in 1969 in Kingsland, where they grew up, playing bingo and dominoes and fishing their fishing spots.

Ollie Lea passed away on August 9, 1997 in Kingsland at the age of 93 and is buried in the Kingsland Cemetery next to Manson T. who passed away in 1982. She had seven grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

Her daughter Jan Corn still lives in the old Clearman homestead on Selman St. Her son Bud lives in Buchanan Dam, Texas.

D. Name of Ancestor OLLIE LEA CLEARMAN

Ollie Lea Clearman was the fourth daughter of William (Walter) and Marguerite Catherine (Maggie) Clearman and was born on March 12, 1904 in Waldo, Coryell County, Texas.

Walter and Maggie Clearman with their four daughters, Vada, Leta Mae (Dick), Alta, and Ollie Lea moved back to Kingsland in late 1904 when Ollie Lea was an infant.

Her father was instrumental in starting the Clearman Telephone Company (later known as The Kingsland Rural Telephone Company). Walter with the help of Maggie and the three older girls ran the switchboard located in a back room of their home. Walter rode horseback to check the lines and poles.

Ollie Lea started school in 1910 in The Kingsland Elementary School which was located in the vicinity of the present laundromat, across from the shopping center. Since Ollie Lea was the baby of the family, she had the luxury of watching and learning to do the chores and operate the switchboard. This would be very important in later years, as a teenager, when her father was heavily involved, not only with the telephone company, but farming, as Justice of the Peace, and the publisher of The Kingsland Rustler Newspaper.

When Ollie Lea was 14, Walter managed the Antler Hotel (still standing near the railroad tracks). This was one of her very happy periods because of the excitement generated during warm weather when excursion trains brought Austinites on weekend outings; there were barbecues and dances at the old pavillion located near the Antler in those days. Ollie Lea helped her mother, Maggie, in the dining room and was lucky enough to participate in all the fun. This was where she attended her first dance; she could remember it as if it was yesterday. When she could not be found at the hotel or pavillion, she was riding her Spanish pony along the Colorado and Llano Rivers.

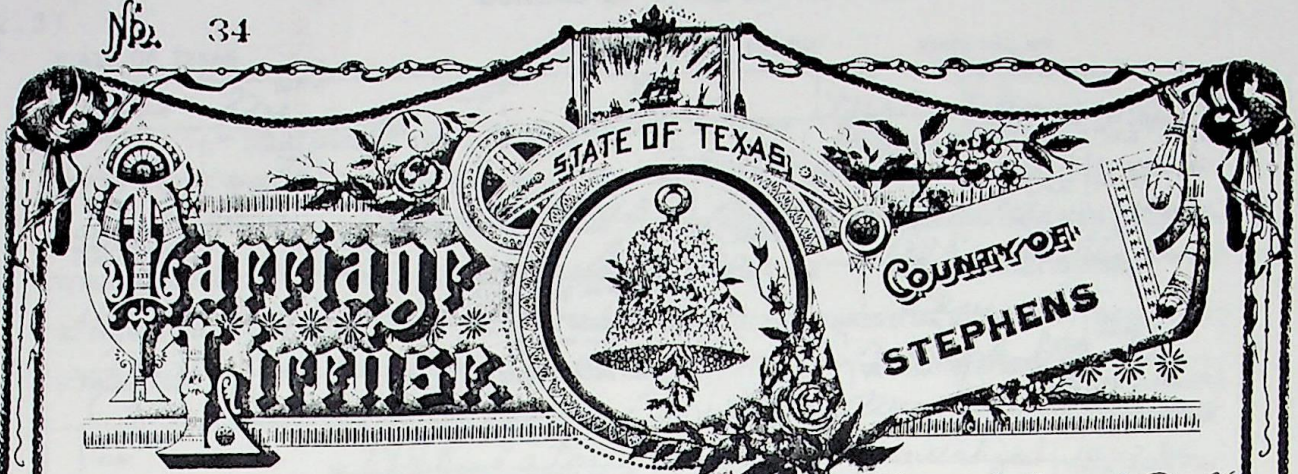

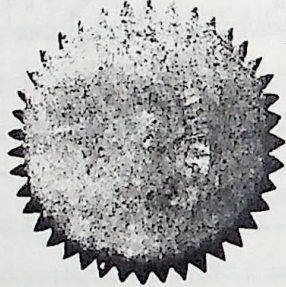

Ollie Lea Clearman was the fourth daughter of William (Walter) and Marguerite Catherine (Maggie) Clearman and was born on March 12, 1904 in Waldo, Coryell County, Texas.

Walter and Maggie Clearman with their four daughters, Vada, Leta Mae (Dick), Alta, and Ollie Lea moved back to Kingsland in late 1904 when Ollie Lea was an infant.

Her father was instrumental in starting the Clearman Telephone Company (later known as The Kingsland Rural Telephone Company). Walter with the help of Maggie and the three older girls ran the switchboard located in a back room of their home. Walter rode horseback to check the lines and poles.

Ollie Lea started school in 1910 in The Kingsland Elementary School which was located in the vicinity of the present laundromat, across from the shopping center. Since Ollie Lea was the baby of the family, she had the luxury of watching and learning to do the chores and operate the switchboard. This would be very important in later years, as a teenager, when her father was heavily involved, not only with the telephone company, but farming, as Justice of the Peace, and the publisher of The Kingsland Rustler Newspaper.

When Ollie Lea was 14, Walter managed the Antler Hotel (still standing near the railroad tracks). This was one of her very happy periods because of the excitement generated during warm weather when excursion trains brought Austinites on weekend outings; there were barbecues and dances at the old pavillion located near the Antler in those days. Ollie Lea helped her mother, Maggie, in the dining room and was lucky enough to participate in all the fun. This was where she attended her first dance; she could remember it as if it was yesterday. When she could not be found at the hotel or pavillion, she was riding her Spanish pony along the Colorado and Llano Rivers.

This period found the Clearmans moving to the family's new and present homestead on what is now called Selman St., it was 1918. Two years later Ollie Lea was sixteen and attended the first of many dances at the Longhorn Cavern, more than a decade before the present entrance steps were constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps during the great depression of the 1930's. She and her friends had to climb down a hole through limestone boulders to get to the dance floor. She said, "it was worth all the trouble, we had great string and brass bands that played popular dance music".

In 1920, her mother, Maggie, passed away. She was still sixteen, so Walter, her dad, had to spend a lot of time with her. They spent many leisure hours fishing and camping on the Llano River. She thought, till the day she passed away, she was the expert on how to fish and where the best fishing holes were. Her favorite saying was, "if the wind is out of the east, they bite the least. If the wind is out of the west, they bite the best".

In 1922, Ollie Lea was eighteen and a very experienced switchboard operator who helped her dad at the office, now located next to their home, on the night shift.

Ollie Lea left for Tyler Business School in 1923. She finished her schooling and returned home to Kingsland to help her dad till he retired in 1926.

On February 5, 1927, she married Manson T. Haile, son of Jeff D. Haile, also of Kingsland, in Brackenridge, Texas. They started their married life in Borger, Texas where their first child was born, a son, Garnett C. on July 30, 1928. They soon moved to Sunray, Texas for a while and then to Dumas, Texas where their second child was born, a daughter, Donna Jan on December 8, 1931

Ollie Lea's training on the switchboard paid off at start of World War II. She went to work at the Cactus Ordinance Plant in Dumas, as a PBX and Teletype operator.

In 1945, they moved to San Antonio, Texas, Manson soon went to work as construction pipefitter and would require a lot of travelling. They travelled from Texas to the northeast states. In the late 1960's, they moved to Bloomington, Texas where Manson was employed by Brown & Root in Seadrift, Texas.

They returned to Kingsland as often as possible to finish the restoration of the old Clearman homestead, started in 1947, along with Ollie Lea's sister, Dick and her husband, A. D.. They lived in Kingsland while Ollie Lea and Manson were working away from home. They retired in 1969 in Kingsland, where they grew up, playing bingo and dominoes and fishing their fishing spots.

Ollie Lea passed away on August 9, 1997 in Kingsland at the age of 93 and is buried in the Kingsland Cemetery next to Manson T. who passed away in 1982. She had seven grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

Her daughter Jan Corn still lives in the old Clearman homestead on Selman St. Her son Bud lives in Buchanan Dam, Texas.

Hubert William Hill was born in Kingsland, Llano County, Texas on August 03, 1897. His parents were William Henry Hill and Carrie Moore Hill who were Kingsland residents. Hubert attended the Public School in Kingsland as an adolescent and teenager. As a young man, before marriage, he worked in his father's Kingsland General Mercantile Store. The store was situated about two blocks from the historic and still standing Antlers Hotel which is located near Texas Highway 1431.

April 30, 1917, Hubert, 20, married Vada William Clearman, 21, in Lubbock, Texas where they lived for a short time. The urge to return to Kingsland prevailed and Hubert began his business career operating a drug store and a fur trading company. On March 21, 1918 the Hills were blessed with their first child, Dorman William Hill, born in Kingsland. Another year passed then Hubert's entrepreneurial calling precipitated his next move to bustling Llano in 1919.

Llano allowed Hubert to spread his wings into several business ventures. His enterprise system consisted of a produce packing plant, a fur trading post, a wholesale wood yard and feed lot, a wool/mohair inspection service and rental property. Hubert and his family were prospering when baby daughter, Marguerite Karolyn Hill, was born October 27, 1921. Hubert's good fortune in business continued through the 1920's and the early 1930's. The Hills lived in a neat white cottage on the old route of Texas Highway 29. The home still stands (in 1996) on the same spot at what is now known as 602 Ellis Street.

It was in the early 1930's that family matters became strained for an extended period of time then finally collapsed. This, of course, resulted in the pain of a 1932 divorce. Hubert moved to Austin, Texas where he married Leona Burton. They had three children, Veda, Charles and John. During the 1940's and 1950's Hubert operated a successful Austin wholesale grocery business. His second marriage was destined to the same fate as the first. Hubert and Leona were divorced in 1952 but he continued to live and work in Austin until the 1960's when he retired and moved to California. He died in California Circa 1968 and is buried in a cemetery near the San Francisco Airport.

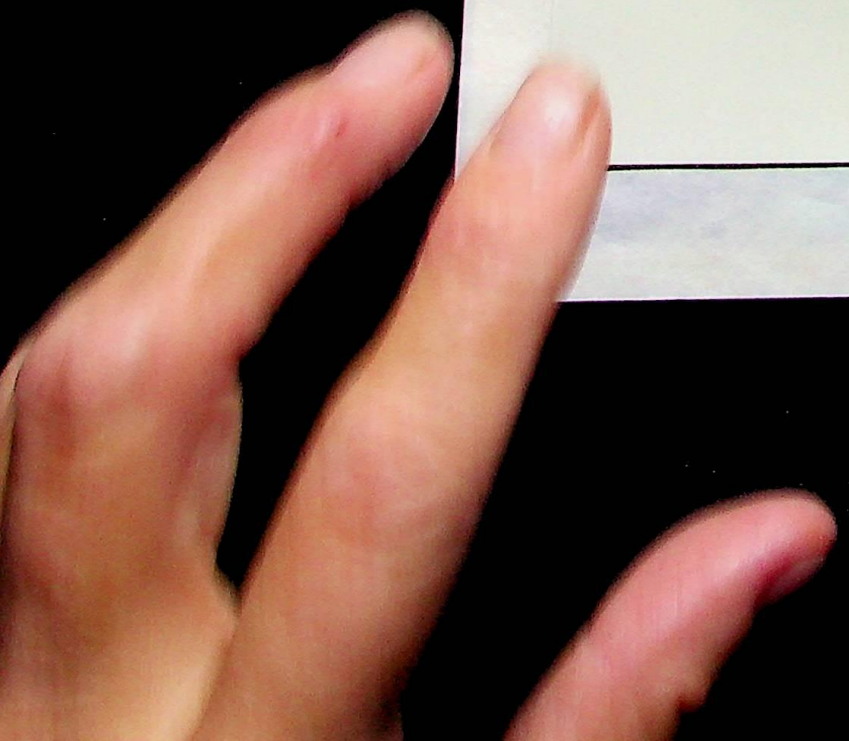

D. Name of Ancestor Hubert William Hill

Hubert William Hill was born in Kingsland, Llano County, Texas on August 03, 1897. His parents were William Henry Hill and Carrie Moore Hill who were Kingsland residents. Hubert attended the Public School in Kingsland as an adolescent and teenager. As a young man, before marriage, he worked in his father's Kingsland General Mercantile Store. The store was situated about two blocks from the historic and still standing Antlers Hotel which is located near Texas Highway 1431.

April 30, 1917, Hubert, 20, married Vada William Clearman, 21, in Lubbock, Texas where they lived for a short time. The urge to return to Kingsland prevailed and Hubert began his business career operating a drug store and a fur trading company. On March 21, 1918 the Hills were blessed with their first child, Dorman William Hill, born in Kingsland. Another year passed then Hubert's entrepreneurial calling precipitated his next move to bustling Llano in 1919.

Llano allowed Hubert to spread his wings into several business ventures. His enterprise system consisted of a produce packing plant, a fur trading post, a wholesale wood yard and feed lot, a wool/mohair inspection service and rental property. Hubert and his family were prospering when baby daughter, Marguerite Karolyn Hill, was born October 27, 1921. Hubert's good fortune in business continued through the 1920's and the early 1930's. The Hills lived in a neat white cottage on the old route of Texas Highway 29. The home still stands (in 1996) on the same spot at what is now known as 602 Ellis Street.

It was in the early 1930's that family matters became strained for an extended period of time then finally collapsed. This, of course, resulted in the pain of a 1932 divorce. Hubert moved to Austin, Texas where he married Leona Burton. They had three children, Veda, Charles and John. During the 1940's and 1950's Hubert operated a successful Austin wholesale grocery business. His second marriage was destined to the same fate as the first. Hubert and Leona were divorced in 1952 but he continued to live and work in Austin until the 1960's when he retired and moved to California. He died in California Circa 1968 and is buried in a cemetery near the San Francisco Airport.

COMMEMORATIVE CERTIFICATE - BIOGRAPHY OF ANCESTOR

D. Name of Ancestor WILLIAM J. JENNINGS and ELIZABETH HOPPER

William J. JENNINGS was born 25 Aug 1799 in Fairfield County South Carolina. He migrated with relatives to Lafayette County Missouri where he and Elizabeth HOPPER were married 9 Mar 1828. (Ref. 1) She was born 27 May 1811 in Indiana to Thomas HOPPER and Rebecca GRAY. William is mentioned as "from Tennessee, as one of the early settlers of Clay Twp", p.70 of HISTORY OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY MISSOURI by G. H. Bates 1881. He and his family are on census records for that county in 1830 p.258, 1840 p.156 and 1850 as a farmer owning slaves with real estate value of \$3,000. William's brother, James, took his family to Grayson Co. Texas in 1846, then William and brother, John, left Missouri and came to Texas in the early fifties. John eventually settled in Burnet County Texas. In 1851 William paid taxes on 372 acres of land, slaves, horses etc. total value \$1,622 in Williamson County Texas. This land was purchased 11 Dec 1850, Vol. 2 p.58. In 1852 he paid taxes on total value \$2,067 on Negroes, horses and an additional 224 acres of land, date of deed being 2 Jan 1852, Vol. 3 p.102, bringing total acres of land to 598. This land was probably owned by William's heirs until many years after his death.

In 1857 with total \$4,740 and in 1858 with total of \$3,860, William and Elizabeth JENNINGS paid taxes in Llano County Texas on slaves, livestock etc., but no land. On 17 Jan 1858 William J. JENNINGS was on a list of signatures on a petition "not to change boundaries of Llano County". (Ref. 2) The family is Dw.#2 on the 1860 census for San Saba County. William, Elizabeth and sons paid taxes in San Saba 1859 through 1862 on slaves, livestock etc. On 31 Jan 1862 William purchased 160 acres of land on Fall Creek, a tributary of the Colorado River, in the northeastern part of Llano County. On 23 Jan 1863 he purchased 320 acres of land in Llano and San Saba Counties on the headwaters of Fall Creek, being lands for sale of alternate sections of the Fisher and Miller's Colony. (Ref. 3)

Because of the Civil War and the loss of their slaves the total value of their property dropped from \$5,465 in 1864 to \$735 in 1865, taxes being paid in Llano County. William J. JENNINGS died 5 Mar 1866 and is buried in the Sand Hill Cemetery at Bend in Lampasas County. Bend is located just across the Colorado River from where William owned land. His is one of the two oldest monuments in the cemetery. His monument has the following inscription, "His many virtues form the noblest monument to his memory". On the 1870 Llano Co. Census Elizabeth was living in household #36 with son, Thomas, and daughter Catherine and her husband, Houston Shults. Llano County land deed records dated 3 May 1873 shows where Elizabeth and son, W. T., sold the land in Llano and San Saba Counties. (Ref. 4)

Between William's death in 1866 and the sale of the land in 1873, taxes were paid by Elizabeth and Thomas on land, livestock etc., but no more slaves. On p.450 of the 1880 San Saba Co. census, we find Elizabeth living with her daughter, Catherine Shults and family. Her children and other relatives are listed as living nearby Elizabeth on both the 1870 and 1880 census records. She probably lived with some of her children for the remainder of her life. She died 13 Jun 1895 and is buried in Waters Creek Cemetery, just off Hwy. 71 seven miles southeast of Llano. Her inscription reads, "Call not back the dear departed Anchored safe where storms are o'er Soon to meet and part no more". (Ref 5-tax)

Children of William and Elizabeth JENNINGS were as follows: Mabry b 1828 d 1856 md Sarah E. HUDDLESTON, Verlinda b ca 1832 d 1852 md Thomas GOOCH, Richard Stramkie b ca 1835 md Mary W. SHULTS, Margaret Ann b 1841 d 1930 md F. M. SHULTS, Eliza "Louisa" b 1844 d ca 1935 md Wade H. "Buck" BLEVINS, William Thomas b ca 1847 md Laura, Catherine b ca 1851 md Houston SHULTS and Angeline T. b ? md John SHELL. These children are named in an affidavit dated 8 Sep 1938 found in the Williamson County courthouse. (Ref. 6) Some information on this family can be found in the following books: WILLIAMSON, BASTROP, TRAVIS, LEE AND BURLESON COUNTIES, Lewis Publishing Co. Chicago 1891; SOME JENNINGS ANCESTORS, THEIR DESCENDANTS AND ALLIED FAMILIES by Jennings Bland Pope. See also Pope's verticle file.

William's father was John JENNINGS born in the Camden District South Carolina about 1761 and the name of his mother is not known. According to the above listed 1891 history of Texas book, "John was only a lad of fourteen when the Revolutionary War started". He served in the South Carolina Militia after the fall of Charleston. (Ref. 7) He moved to Georgia after 1805 and then to Wilson County Tennessee by 1821. It is not known when or where John died, but it was probably on the migration trail to Missouri.

Elizabeth's parents were (Ref. 8) Thomas HOPPER born about 1766 Georgia and Rebecca GRAY born North Carolina about 1768. They were probably married in North Carolina about 1791. They migrated from North Carolina through Indiana where four of their children were born and land entries are found in Lawrence County in 1817. This is taken from p.148 of INDIANA LAND ENTRIES- VINCENNES DISTRICT 1807-1877 by Waters. On the 1821 Missouri tax list from Lafayette and Lillard Counties, Thomas HOPPER is listed for delinquent and miscellaneous legal taxes. The family is listed on the Lafayette County MO census records as follows: 1830 p.256 with three slaves; 1840 p.156 in agriculture with six slaves and 1850 p.256 in Clay Twp. Farmer with value of real estate \$7,000. The will of Thomas HOPPER was written in 1851 and filed in Jan 1857 in Lafayette County. Rebecca died some time after the death of her husband and they are both buried in the Hopper Burying Ground near Wellington MO, according to a HOPPER researcher who lived in the area. Children named in their father's will were: William b ca 1792 d bef 1851 md Ann, Sally b ca 1794 md John YOUNG, Lydia Ann b 1795 d bef 1851 md KILLIAN, Polly b ca 1798 md Jesse HITCHCOCK, Charles b 1800 - d 1880 md Rebecca A. HOPPER, Keziah b 1806 md Joshua HITCHCOCK, Hannah b 1808 d 1882 md #1 Charles McCLURE #2 John BARKER, Elizabeth b 1811 d 1895 md William JENNINGS, Thomas b ca 1815 md Jane, Rebecca b ca 1818 md Zachariah PETERSON, Elmira b ca 1820 md John JENNINGS.

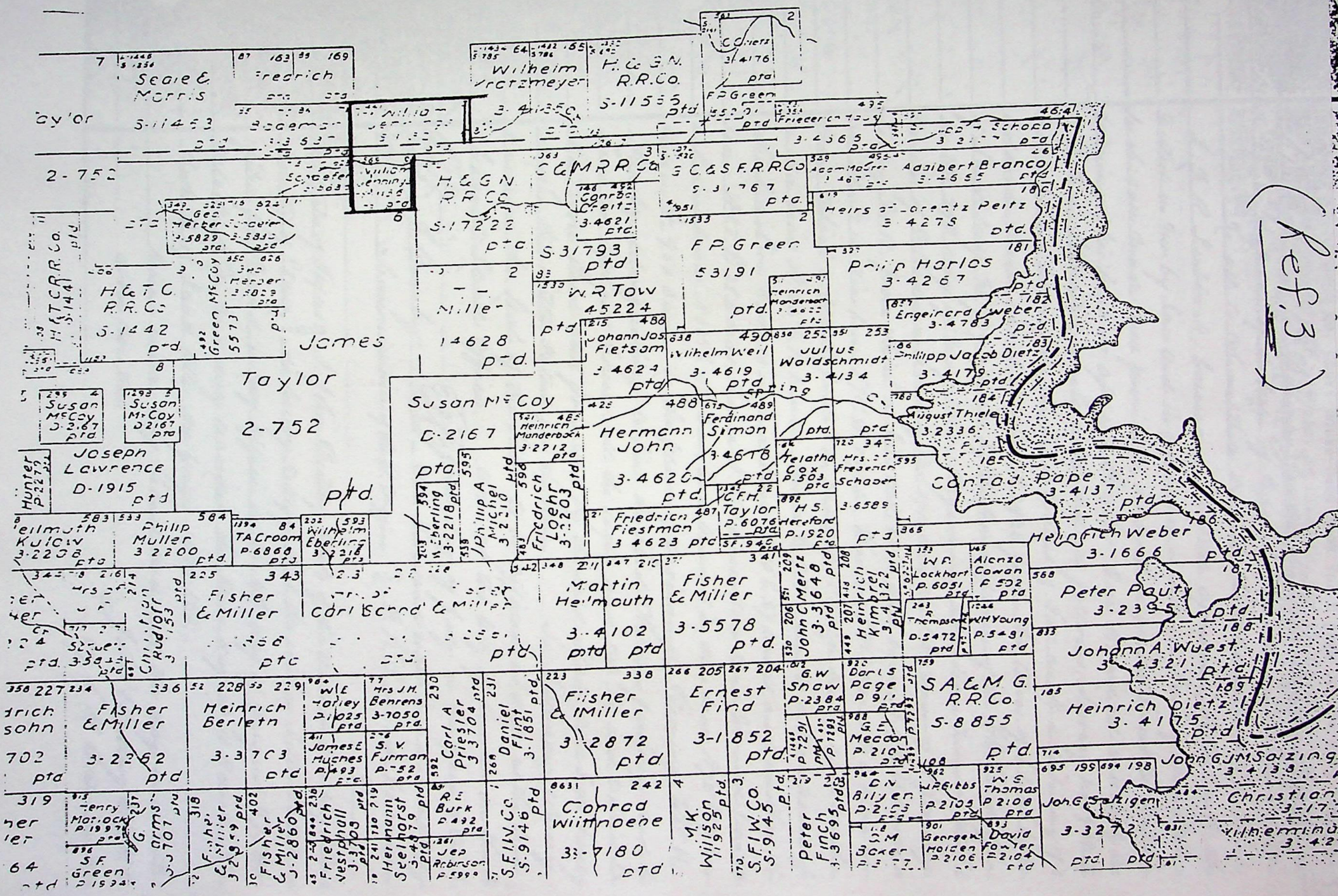

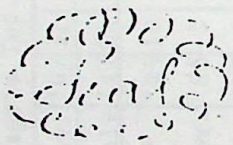

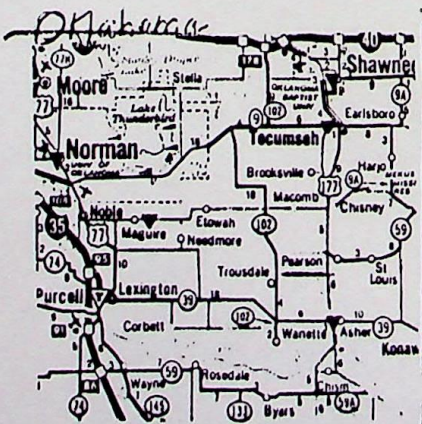

1. (VI) John Jennings is named in two biographical sketches, one published in 1889 (1); the other, in 1893 (2). Additionally, his approx b date is indicated as c1761, his Revolutionary War service is mentioned, and the migration route of his s William (bro of (V) John) is stated to be FCo GA TN LCo. See 1893 quotation in Note 3, Gen 7: It states that (VI) John's s William was raised in FCo, indicating departure from SC did not occur until several yrs after William's b (which was prob 1799, considering info in 30 40 50 LCo). The 1889 quotation in Note 31, Gen V identifies (VI) John and his s James and places James in SC at b and in WCo c1813, in LCo c 1824, JCo c1825 and in GCo 1847 (he was there in SC-- see Note 10, Gen V). These mentions in secondary sources are the only definite clues found to date re (VI) John. Efforts to identify him in census, land, and probate records have failed, to date, largely because there were so many people using the same name, John Jennings.

There is no assurance that James Jennings b 1788 and William Jennings b 1799 are full bro of (V) John, although they are treated as such in this volume. They were in the right places at the right times to be bro of (V) John, but they could just as well be half-brothers, uncles, or cousins.

For (VI) John to have been 14 at start of Revolution c1775 indicates he was b c1761. Thus, at b of (V) John in 1802, (VI) John would be 41, so (V) John's mo could be 1/w 2/w 3/w of (VI) John. Further, if (VII) _____ Jennings was b c1735 he was 40 at start of Revolution, thus was doubtless involved, too--nearly everybody was, on one side or the other. SC was one of most prized of Britain's American colonies and there was much bitter fighting there. Revolutionary govt lacked means to pay for services and supplies during war, so, after war, certificates of indebtedness (indents) were issued for claims that were audited and found valid. (South Carolina, a Short History 1520-1948 by David Duncan Wallace U of SC Press Columbia 1951 p 333.) Seventeen such indents were issued to "John Jennings". (SC Archives.) But which John Jennings? What part of state? Only one identifies Camden District which included FCo among other co. Examination of DAR Patriot Index and 3 supplements shows no desc of (VI) John has been admitted to DAR membership based on his patriotic service.

Heads of Families - First Census of the United States - 1790 - South Carolina Govt Print Office 1908 shows that while there were seven Jennings heads of hh in Camden Dist SC (3 Johns, George, Henry, Robert, and T), only two Jennings were in FCo area of Camden Dist: John and Robert. The name "Robert" was not carried on in this branch of fam, but this John could be (VI) John, or (VII) John with (VI)

John included in the hh (members of hh not listed by name until 50). In the hh, including the head, there were: 3 free white males 16 and over; 3 free white males under 16; and 2 free white females. It must be remembered that there is no reason to believe that early SC census records were complete. Quite the opposite.

Comparison of 1790 and 1800 censuses for FCo shows two (m) left the hh during that decade. They were over 16 and toward 1800 were at least 26. Also, a (m) under 26 left. No (f) left during the decade, indicating it was an elderly fam. The fam was gone from FCo by 1810. Some may have gone to Edgefield Co, which also picked up more Jennings than are likely to have come from FCo (if the censuses were complete which they prob were not).

In 1800 FCo there was a John Jennings b before 1756 who could be the same as the John Ginning Sr in Edgefield Co SC 1810 census b before 1766. Next door in 1810 was a John Ginning Jr b between 1766 and 1784. Both were gone by 1820. No clue has been found proving or disproving a connection with them.

It is possible that (VI) John mov from FCo to Edgefield Co c1804. Almost certainly some John Jennings and w Mary did, and sold FCo land while liv in Edgefield Co (FCo D-Bk Q p 81 21 July 1804).

Georgia

Some time between 1802 and 1813, and prob c1805, the fam mov from SC to GA.

After Revolution, GA was beset for two decades with gigantic land speculations and frauds as well as with controversy in persuading federal govt to force Indians out of lands the state claimed. State was opened to white settlement in series of treaties with Indians. By 1803 the state saw need for granting land in small tracts, to attract settlers. Two systems were used but each resulted in family-size holdings rather than huge tracts: Head-right system involving some cost increasing as size of tract increased, and lottery system. Lure of this cheap land drew (VI) John into GA. (Georgia, a Short History by E Merton Coulter, Chapel Hill U of NC Press 1960.)

Prob several years between say 1805 and 1813 were spent by the fam in GA. See Note 3, Gen V. Location in GA not known but presumed to have been eastern GA considering dates Indians ceded lands as illustrated in The American Heritage Pictorial Atlas of United States History 1966 pp 119 and 143. Little is known of fam stay in GA. Biographical sketch cited in Note 3, Gen V merely mentions the state. Possible clues as to counties to search in GA contained in Beatrice Doughtie's book have not been pursued.

Tennessee

Exact time the fam entered TN is not known, but was prob c15-17 yr after TN became a state in 1796. Certainly it was between 1802 and 1821 (b and m dates of (V) John).

It was prob about time of War of 1812. Prob by 1813 the fam was in WCo: (V) John's bro James m TN girl and had ch in WCo 1814 per 1889 biographical sketch cited in Note 31, Gen V. Prob (V) John and (VI) John were there at the same time. (VI) John's estate settlement has been sought in that area without success. One complicating factor is knowledge from Beatrice Doughtie's book that there was another Jennings branch in WCo at same time.

WCo is in Central Basin in middle TN E of Nashville and S of Cumberland R. By 1806, this area had been acquired from Indians by treaties, and immigrants poured in. From TN entry to Union in 1796 until 1818 and to lesser extent until 1825, land-titles were confused by conflicting claims by: (1) U S (2) holders of NC-issued warrants (3) TN-grantees (4) squatters. After 1806 price was \$2 per a. The fam was in area of good land, but with title problems, and land speculation led Panic of 1819. (Tennessee, a Short History by Stanley J Folmsbee et al U of TN Press Knoxville 1969.) There were several "John Jennings" grantee deeds in WCo that may have involved this branch of fam (either (V) John or (VI) John):

Another source of info is the 8 Jan 1934 letter from Thonotosassa, FL by "M.E.J." stating, "I am a daughter of John Jennings, and Miry (means Elmira--JBP) Jennings, her father was Thomas Hopper her mother was Becky Gray Hopper.... My grandfather's name was James Jennings, grandmother's name was Patsy Rutland Jennings, they were married in Virginia (I doubt this---JBP). My grandfather had a brother named Jack and one named William and one named Allen, I think they all moved from Virginia to Tennessee and from there to Mo. Then all except Allen to Texas. My grandfather's brother William married Betsy Hopper my mother's sister, Uncle William and Uncle Jack moved to South West Texas. My grandfather settled near what was afterwards Sherman, Texas. My father moved from Missouri in 1847 and settled 9 miles north of Sherman, Texas. My grandfather had a sister named Polly Jennings who married William Jones of Bonham, Texas. They had several children: Louisa never married. Mandanie and Milbury married John O. and Brice Austin. The present John D. is a son of John O. Austin and Mandane Jones Austin...."

I Thomas Hopper of the County of Lafayette and State, of Missouri being of sound mind but feeble in body and considering the uncertainty of mortal life do make and constitute this my last will and testament revoking thereby all former wills.

1st It is my will and desire that all my funeral expenses and Just debts be paid.

2nd It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Rebecca Hopper shall have the farm on which I now live with all the appurtenances belonging to the same and all stock of every description and all household and Kitchen furniture, my two Negroes namely a girl named Lucy and a boy named John also the sum of two hundred dollars in cash during her natural life.

3rd It is my will and desire that my son Thomas Hopper remain on the farm during the life of my wife.

4 It is my will and desire that my son Thomas receive from my Executor after my death the sum of five hundred dollars and the negro boy John after the death of my wife, provided the said Thomas will relinquish his right title and interest to the following described real estate viz the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of section No. One (1) Township forty nine (49) and Range twenty eight (28) containing thirty nine 34/100 acres and it is my further will and desire that if my said son Thomas should die without living issue that the whole amount of the above named legacy shall return to and make part of my estate.

5th It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife that Hanrah McClure shall have my negro Girl Lucy and her increase if there should be any.

I have already given to the legatees of my son William Hopper deceased their full share of my estate forever except his son Ari to whom I will and bequeath the sum fifty dollars.

I have already given to my son Charles his portion of my estate during the life of my wife.

I have already given to my daughter Rebecca Peterson her portion of my estate during the life of my wife.

I have already given to my daughter Almy Jennings her full portion of my estate forever.

6 I will and bequeath to my grand daughter Eveline Johnson to be paid her after my death the sum of fifty Dollars.

7 I will and bequeath to the children of my daughter Lydia Killion deceased the sum of five hundred Dollars to be equally divided amongst them except Mary Case. I have given her her portion.

I have already given my daughter Elizabeth Jennings her portion until after the death of my wife.

8 I will and bequeath to my daughters Sally Young and Polly Hitchcock each the sum of three hundred dollars.

9th I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth

Jennings the sum of three hundred Dollars to be paid her after the death of my wife.

10th It is my will and desire that my executor shall pay the legacies left to my wife, my son Thomas, my daughters Polly Hitchcock and Sally Young in the order here named out of the first monies coming to his hands.

11th It is my will and desire that my executor shall sell all my land at private sale without dividing the same and that he sell the personal estate at public sale.

12 It is my will that so soon as my executor collects all money due my estate for land and other property, he shall first deduct the expencis of administration, and then divide the balance equally between the following named Children viz Charles Hopper, Rebecca Peterson, Kesiah Hitchcock, Hanna McClure ad Thomas Hopper. And I now appoint my friend and Neighbour William S Evans my executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this seventh day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty one.
